1. INTRODUCTION

The Foreign Trade Statistics Report is produced by the Balance of Payments Unit of the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO). The statistics are primarily obtained from the computerized records maintained by the Customs Department. These records are based on documents on the importation and exportation of goods as completed by importers, exporters or their agents who are required to record the appropriate statistical tariff code using the Cayman Islands Tariff Code (CITC). The CITC is based on the Harmonised System (Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System) of the Customs Cooperation Council (CCC) and the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC) Revision 3.

The task of the ESO is mainly to incorporate and check the credibility of the data, and classify them into tables that can be useful for analysis. The process of classification is a time-intensive, laborious task as there have been a significant number of goods that are not classified or mis-classified. The objective of the classification process has been to minimize the number of such cases; over the years, the value of commodities that are not classified by SITC codes has diminished.

In addition to the classification by SITC codes, ESO also classifies all imported commodities by Broad Economic Category (BEC) based on international guidelines issued by the United Nations (UN).

2. EXPLANATORY NOTES AND DEFINITIONS

2.1 Trade Classification

The Cayman Islands version of the Harmonized System of Classification is the primary classification standard used for the Cayman Islands' foreign trade. In addition, the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC) Rev 3, which is the classification of international trade issued by the United Nations (UN), is used for the compilation of both the imports and exports of goods. Finally, the classification of imports by Broad Economic Categories (BEC) is based on international standards recommended by the UN.

2.2 System of Trade

The "General Trade System" is the system of coverage used in the tabulation of merchandise in this report. Under this system, all goods entering the Cayman Islands are recorded as imports while all goods leaving the country are recorded as exports.

2.3 Coverage

This report covers merchandise trade only. Trade in services are not included.

Included in the import and export statistics in this publication are goods sent abroad and returned for repair and goods re-exported as incorrect or faulty since they cannot be easily identified at the time of import. Excluded are goods in transit or other trans-shipments not destined for the Cayman Islands market, monetary gold and bullion, bank notes and coins in circulation; and parcel post exports for which no records are kept. Goods brought into the country directly by residents but are not declared are also excluded by default for lack of documentation.

The values recorded for imports and exports over a particular period represent the documents brought to account by Customs during that period. They may also include some goods actually arriving towards the end of the previous period but are accounted for in the current period.

Exports are a combination of both domestic and re-exports. Domestic exports include goods produced in the country, extracted from its natural resources or manufactured in the country. These include goods of foreign origin which have been assembled or transformed in the country. Re-exports are goods of foreign origin which have not been materially transformed while in the Cayman Islands.

Exports data are obtained from the counterpart statistical agencies abroad namely, the US Census Bureau, the Jamaica Statistical Institute, and the UK Trade Data Online website.

They include domestic exports and re-exports, however, the majority of the exports are re-exports.

2.4 Valuation

All values are shown in Cayman Islands dollars (CI\$). Imports are valued at cost, insurance and freight (c.i.f) which is the value up to the time of delivery at the port. It includes incidental charges but excludes customs or any other duty paid on arrival.

Exports are valued at free on board (f.o.b), that is the value at which goods were sold by the exporters, and it includes all local charges to the exporting vessel or aircrafts. Freight and insurance are not included.

2.5 Revision

The imports data for the years 2006 to 2009 have been revised, largely as a consequence of corrections on previous errors, omissions, misclassifications as reflected in the updated entries of the Customs computer system.

2.7 Limitations

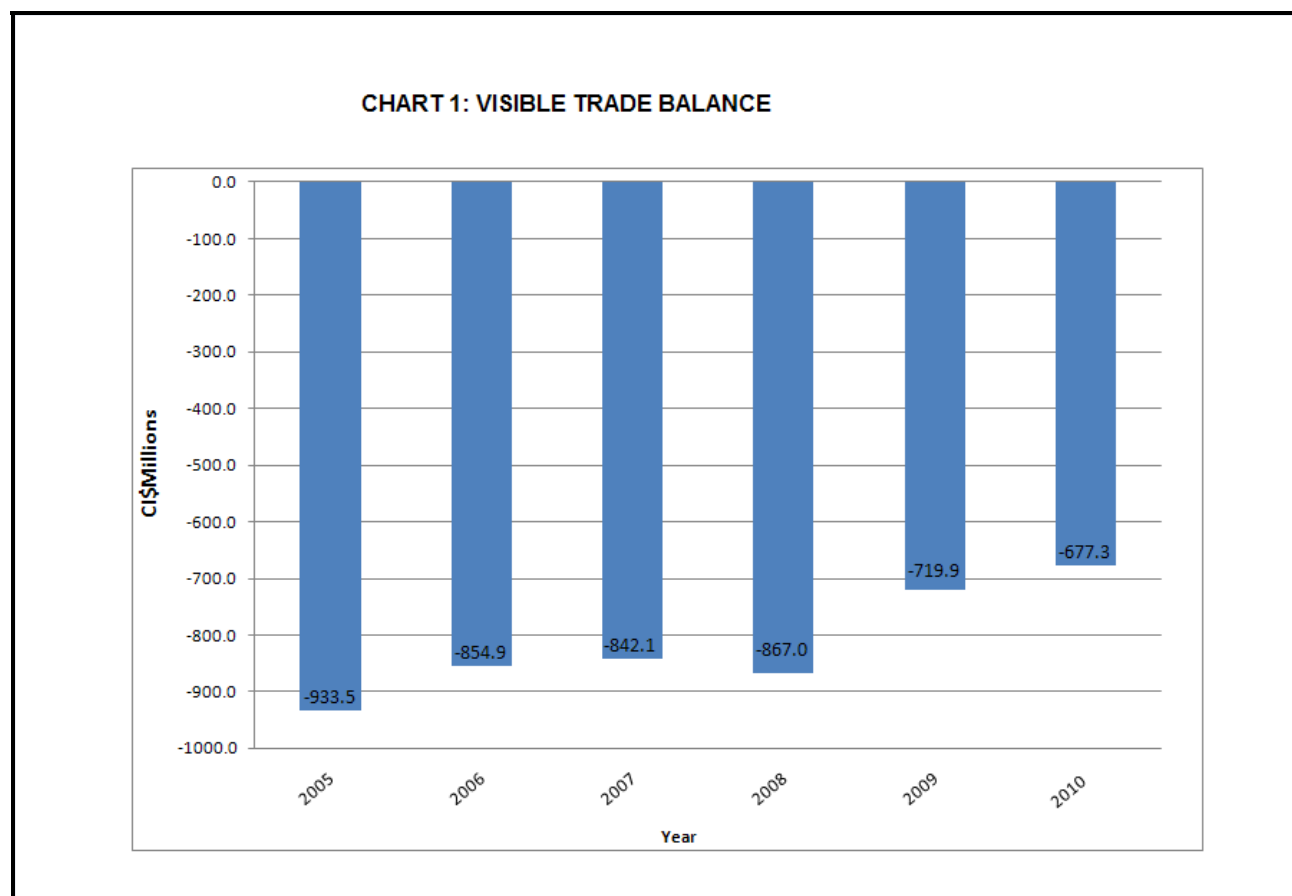
In the Cayman Islands, a number of importers do not provide codes, or provide improper codes. Over the years, this issue required the ESO to vigilantly verify codes and provide missing ones. ESO continues to review the imports data with the aim of improving the accuracy, reliability and proper classification of the data.

Given the volume of imports, full details of the quantity and value of all imports are not available. This will require an upgrade of the current administrative system based at the Cayman Islands Customs Department. At present, only a small proportion of commodities have both quantity and value of imports.

3. COMMENTARY ON TRADE 2010

3.1 Visible trade balance

In 2010, the visible trade balance declined further, contracting by 5.9 percent to reach CI\$677.3 million, compared to CI\$719.9 million recorded in 2009. This performance was largely influenced by the fall in imports.



3.2 Imports

The total value of imports for the year 2010 fell by 6.5 percent, which was at a slower pace when compared to the 16.3 percent decline recorded in 2009. In 2010 total goods imported amounted to \$688.3 million, down from \$735.9 million in 2009 reflecting the continued contraction of economic activities. (see Table 1.2).

Despite the overall decline in total imports, the food and live animals category of imports increased by 27.0 percent, largely reflecting the significant increases in sugar, sugar preparations and honey; coffee, tea, cocoa and spices and miscellaneous edible products.

On the other hand, imports of live animals except fish and cereals and preparations fell (see Table 2.5).

The beverages and tobacco category fell by 2.4 percent despite the 24.7 percent increase in tobacco products, largely due to increases in price, while importation of beverages decreased by 4.4 percent.

The importation of mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials increased by 22.7 percent to \$110.8 million in 2010. This can be attributed to the increased per unit cost of fuel products, in view of a reduction in quantities.

A 19.2 percent increase in imports of chemical and related products was recorded in 2010. In this category, increases were recorded in essential oil, perfume and toiletry products (22.2%) and in medicinal and pharmaceutical products (2.6%), while organic chemicals, fertilizers and plastic products declined by 23.6 percent, 23.3 percent, and a 45.3 percent respectively.

Manufactured goods classified chiefly by materials, showed a decline of 7.6 percent. Accounting for this downturn was a 46.6 percent drop in iron and steel products and a 34.1 percent drop in cement products, reflecting the reduction in construction activities. However, paper and paper products recorded an increase of 42.1 percent.

The machinery and transport equipment category recorded a 7.3 percent increase with the sub-categories of power generating machinery and equipment increasing by 17.9 percent; office machines and computer related equipment increasing by 43.1 percent and general industrial machinery and equipment increasing by 52.2 percent. However, aircraft, boats, ships and associated equipment recorded a decline of 24.2 percent and road vehicles, 4.2 percent.

The overall decline in imports is also traced to decreases recorded in the miscellaneous manufactured articles (41.7%) and in commodities not classified elsewhere (2.9%).

The total amount of duty-free imports reached CI\$103.2 million in 2010 as compared to \$131.7 million recorded in 2009. This represents a reduction of 21.7 percent. Duty-free imports comprised 15 percent of total imports in 2010 compared to 17.9 percent in 2009 (see Table 2.3).

An analysis of imports by broad economic classification (BEC) reveals that consumer goods fell by 4.8 per cent and stood at \$296.4 million compared to \$311.2 million in 2009. Food and beverages which accounts for 48.6 per cent of consumer goods increased by 20.3 percent while other consumer goods fell by 21.9 per cent.

Intermediate goods fell by 18.4 percent, largely reflecting the 17.2 per cent decline in construction imports.

A 12.4 per cent drop was recorded in capital goods largely on account of the 8.3 per cent fall in transportation goods and 14.1 percent fall in other capital goods.

Fuel and lubricants which accounts for 15.8 per cent of imports by BEC, increased by 21.9 per cent, largely resulting from increases in prices.

3.3 Exports

In 2010, total exports which comprise largely of re-exports, fell significantly by 30.8 percent to \$11.1 million compared to the 28.4 percent increase recorded in 2009. All export categories showed a decrease with the exception of crude materials.

For that same period, commodities and transactions not elsewhere classified which comprises largely of a variety of items re-exported, continues to dominate the value of re-exports contributing 62.9 percent of total exports, while machinery and transportation equipment contributed 10.0 percent in 2010.

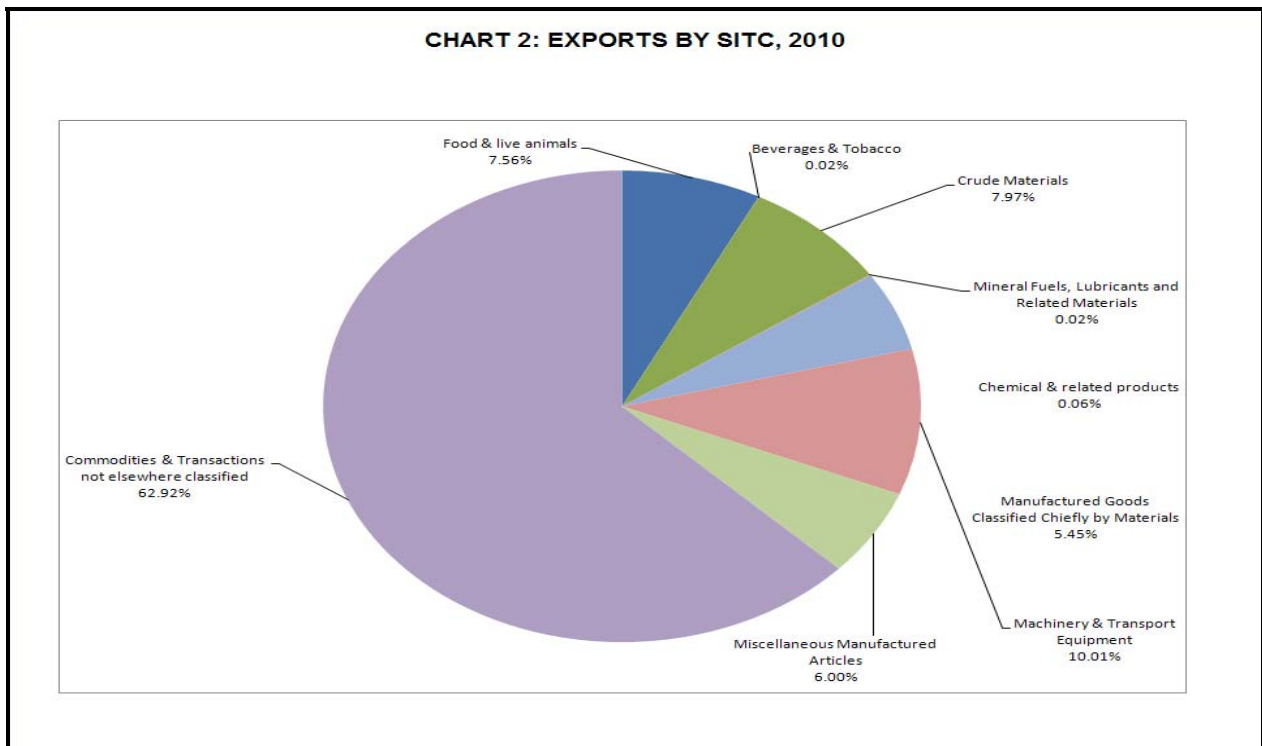

CHART 3: IMPORTS BY SITC SECTION, 2010

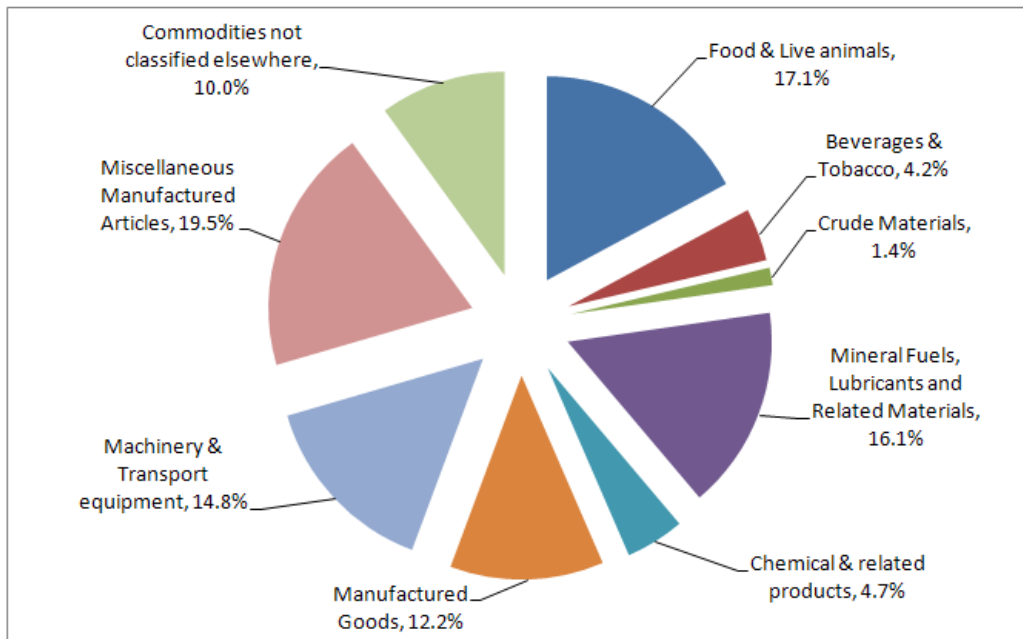
