## 1. INTRODUCTION

This report presents the findings of the Fall 2018 Labour Force Survey (LFS). The LFS mainly provides information on the characteristics of persons in the labour force (employed and unemployed). It also presents demographic information on the general population, as well as on characteristics of persons not in the labour force and on household characteristics.

The concepts used in the survey are in accordance with the International Labour Organization (ILO) guidelines, and therefore, the indicators produced from the Survey are comparable to those used internationally.

The remaining sections of this report present the methodology (Section 2), the main findings with emphasis on the characteristics of the labour force, and those that are out of the labour force (Section 3) and other findings on housing characteristics (Section 4). The Appendix presents the detailed tables.

## 2. METHODOLOGY

As in previous LFS, planning and execution of the Fall 2018 LFS was undertaken by the staff of the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO), a department in the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development of the Cayman Islands Government.

### Sampling design

The sampling frame for the LFS is the ESO's Household Register which is a listing of all household dwelling units in the Cayman Islands derived. A comprehensive update of the register was conducted between February and August 2016 based on information obtained from the 2015 Household Budget Survey; updates were also based on information from the Fall 2017 LFS and Spring 2017 LFS. As of September 2017, the Register listed 25,557 household dwelling units, which is the sampling frame used for this edition of the LFS.

Samples for the LFS were drawn from districts of the Cayman Islands. Cayman Brac and Little Cayman were combined to form the stratum Sister Islands. Probability proportionate to household count by district, as determined from the ESO Household Register, was used when allocating the number of selected households across strata. Households were randomly selected from all of the six districts; within each district, the households were selected with equal probability. The probability of selection for the sampled households in each district can be expressed as follows:

$$P_h = m_h / M_h$$

Where:

$P_h$  = probability of selection for the sample households in the h-th stratum (district)

$M_h$  = total number of households in the sample frame for the h-th stratum

$m_h$  = the number of sample households selected in the h-th stratum

Based on the sampling design, a sample of 1,504 household addresses was randomly selected representing 5.9 percent of all household addresses. The total number of households during the survey period was eventually adjusted to 27,922 based on post-survey results<sup>1</sup>.

## Fieldwork

Since the October 2014 LFS, the ESO has been using tablets for electronic data collection in Grand Cayman. Tablets were also used in the Sister Islands in the Fall 2016 LFS, however for the Fall 2018 LFS paper forms were used due to logistical issues. Attached in the Appendix (page 127) is a copy of the questionnaire that was uploaded to the tablet for this edition of the LFS.

The reference week for the Fall 2018 LFS was the week September 23 – September 29, 2018. The data collection took place over a five-week period starting September 30, 2018 and ended on November 6, 2018. The administrative data (births, deaths, and work permits) as of end of December 2018 which were used in estimating total population, were collected in mid-February 2019.

Experienced supervisors from the ESO conducted four evenings of training in preparation for the fieldwork. A total of 52 persons including ESO survey staff were trained in Grand Cayman, most of whom have prior household survey experience (census and/or LFS). Forty-eight persons were eventually selected to conduct interviews in Grand Cayman. In the Sister Islands (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman), three persons were trained for two days on how to conduct the LFS using the questionnaires on paper.

## Weights

The 2018 population estimate was derived by adding the natural increase (births minus deaths) data collected from the Health Services Authority, and immigration (work permits and change of status) from the Immigration Department in the second semester of 2018 to the 2018 mid-year population estimate.

The raising factors for Caymanian, PR/PR-WRW and Non-Caymanian sub-populations were then calculated based on their respective population estimates,

Where:

$$\text{Raising factor}_{si} = \frac{\text{Population}_{si}}{\text{Survey Count}_{si}}$$

$\text{Population}_{si}$  = estimated population based on administration data of status<sub>i</sub>  
(i=Caymanian, Permanent Residents, and Non-Caymanians)  
 $\text{Survey Count}_{si}$  = number of individuals from the LFS per status.

The household characteristics were raised using the district response rates adjusted for non-responses at the household level.

### Data processing

The survey returns were processed internally by ESO staff members. Data capture was built into the ESO Mobile LFS Project (LFSPRj) software on tablets; returns for the Sister Islands were entered manually on the tablets. Coding of industries and occupation were also conducted internally using the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC) (Rev. 4) and the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO) 2008, respectively. Edit checks were conducted using CPro (Census and Survey Processing System) and SPSS (Statistical Package for the Social Sciences). Data were verified with cross-referencing information stored on the tablets or with a phone call to the respondent. A data file was then created with information from all households who completed the LFS interview (fully and partially). Finally, indicators were generated from this file using SPSS and the final tables presented in this Report were prepared using Excel.

### Standard errors for main estimates

Given the nature of the sample design used in the LFS, the estimates were computed with a 2.5 percent margin of error. The estimates published in this report's tables are rounded to the nearest whole number or person. The sum of the individual rounded numbers may not equal the total. In addition, the difference of one person for the same category in different tables is due to rounding.

Data representing the weighted responses of one individual in the survey are suppressed and indicated by the symbol "..."

The estimates presented in this report are all liable to sampling error. Their absolute sampling error increases with their magnitude, while the relative error decreases the greater the size of the estimate. Generally, the smaller the *Relative Standard Error* (or *Coefficient of Variation*) the more reliable is the estimate. Because of this, comparisons of the larger estimates may be used with confidence, but small estimates must be treated with caution. The *standard errors*,



*confidence intervals and coefficients of variation (C.V.)* of the estimates for key variables for the Fall 2018 LFS are shown in Tables 2 and 3.

### 3. DEFINITION of KEY CONCEPTS

#### ***Population***

In the LFS, population means the “resident” population; that is, persons staying or intending to stay in the Cayman Islands for at least six months. Visitors/tourists are not included in the resident population. Persons in institution for more than six months are excluded. Family members of resident households who were abroad at the time of the survey but have intentions to return to the Islands are also considered as residents.

The population is categorized into three sub-populations by immigration status: Caymanians, Permanent Residents (PR) and Non-Caymanians. Permanent Residents includes Non-Caymanians married to Caymanians, Permanent Residents with government contract, Permanent Residents with rights to work (PR-WRW) and Permanent Resident without rights to work.

#### ***Labour Force***

The labour force is composed of those members of the non-institutional population (i.e. those not in residential institutions such as general penitentiary, retirement homes) 15 years of age and over, who during the reference week were employed or unemployed. All persons in the PR labour force in all tables and sections in this Report refer explicitly to PR-WRW only. Persons categorized as PR without rights to work are included in the Non-Caymanian labour force.

#### ***Employed***

Employed persons are those who, during the reference week, did any work for pay or profit; that is, paid work in the context of an employer – employee relationship, or self-employment. It also includes unpaid family workers who contributed directly to the operation of a farm, business or professional practice, owned or operated by a related member of the household. Based on guidelines of the International Labour Organization (ILO), work can be for as little as an hour during the reference week; it excludes unpaid domestic housework and volunteer work but includes those temporarily away from their jobs.

#### ***Unemployed***

Unemployed persons are those who, during the reference week are:

- (a) without work;
- (b) currently available for work and
- (c) actively looking for a job, or had definite arrangements to start a job within 4 weeks.

#### ***Unemployment Rate***

The unemployment rate represents the number of unemployed persons expressed as a percentage of the labour force. The unemployment rate for a particular group (age, status, sex,

etc.) is the number unemployed in that group expressed as a percentage of the labour force for that group.

$$\text{Unemployment Rate} = \frac{\text{Number of Unemployed}}{\text{Labour Force}} \times 100$$

***Not In the Labour Force***

These are persons in the non-institutional population (i.e. those not in residential institutions such as general penitentiary, retirement homes) – 15 years of age and over - who, during the reference week, were neither employed nor unemployed.

***Household***

A household comprises either one person living alone or a group of persons (not necessarily related) living at the same address, with common housekeeping, i.e. sharing at least one meal a day and sharing living arrangements. This concept is used for persons sharing an apartment or house or a one-room together. ## 4. MAIN FINDINGS

The population of the Cayman Islands was estimated at 65,813. There were 36,705 Caymanians, 5,940 Permanent Residents (of which 4,381 are PR-WRW) and 23,168 Non-Caymanians. The labour force was comprised of 46,178 persons, with 44,887 of them employed and 1,291 unemployed. The labour force participation rate was 85.3 percent while the unemployment rate was 2.8 percent. The unemployment rate and labour force participation rate varied by sex and status (Tables 4 and 5). Figure 1 illustrates the composition of the population and the labour force.

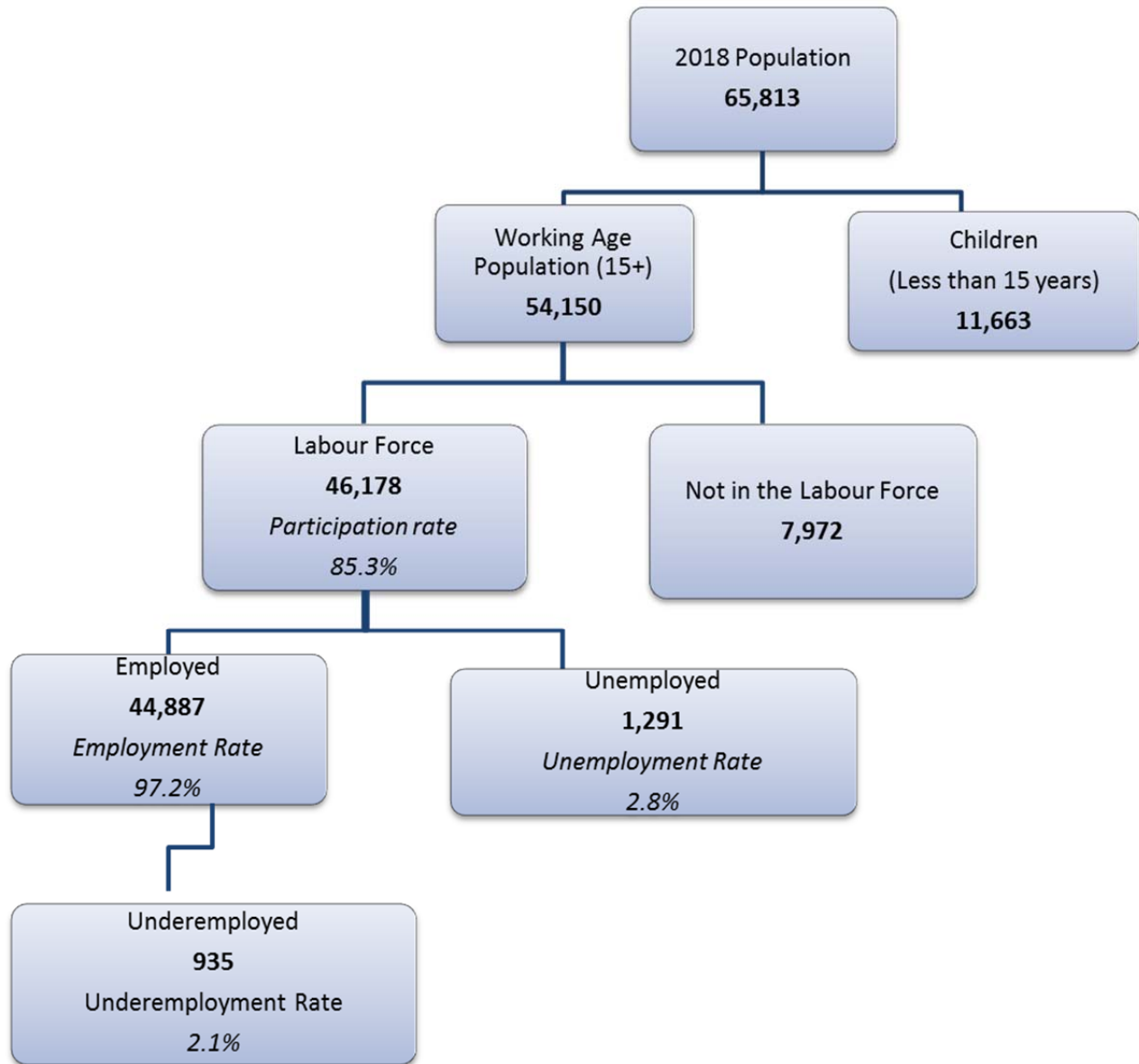

#### 4.1 POPULATION ESTIMATES

For the year ending December 2018, the estimated population of the Cayman Islands stood at 65,813. The majority of Cayman's population lives in Grand Cayman, particularly in George Town which accounted for 53.0 percent of the population. West Bay (19.2%) and Bodden Town (19.2%) each had equal percentages of the population, while North Side population stood at 3.0 percent and East End 2.5 percent respectively. The Sister Islands' (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman) combined population accounted for 3.0 percent (Table 6).

The average household size was 2.4 persons. Bodden Town had the highest household size with 2.6 persons, while West Bay and North Side had the smallest with 2.1 persons.

#### *Sex and Age*

The estimated population in Fall 2018 comprised of 48.4 percent males and 51.6 percent females (Table 7).

Children younger than 15 years old accounted for 17.7 percent of the population while the elderly (65 years or older) represented 7.5 percent. These two groups together are referred to as the 'dependent population' and accounted for a little more than one quarter of the population (25.2%).

The working age population which is the age group comprising persons who are 15 years and older accounted for 82.3 percent of the population. Persons in this age group are usually working or looking for work and are said to be in their 'productive years'. Within this group, persons aged 15 to 64 years are considered to be the ones on whom children (0-14 years) and

elderly (65 and above) depend. The ratio of the latter population groups to the 15 to 64 years old group shows a dependency ratio<sup>2</sup> of 34.1 percent.

### Status

Caymanians comprise the majority (55.8%) of the population while Non-Caymanians and Permanent Residents had a population share of 35.2 and 9.0 percent, respectively. In comparison to Fall 2017, the Caymanian population was 3.8% higher (Table 7).

Among Caymanians, 76.6 percent were in the working age population compared to 90.5 and 89.2 percent of Permanent Residents and Non-Caymanians, respectively (Appendix Table 1.5). The latter is expected since the residency of most expatriates is dependent on work permits.

**4.2 LABOUR FORCE**

The labour force is comprised of persons in the working-age population who worked, as well as those who at the time of the survey, did not have a job, but were available and looking for work during the reference period. In Fall 2018, there were 46,178 persons who were in the labour force (Table 8).

*Sex and age*

In Fall 2018, 49.9 percent of the labour force were males, while females accounted for the remaining 50.1 percent. Most persons in the labour force were reported in the age group 35 to 44 years (28.4%) just slightly more than the group 45 to 54 years (25.2%) while the group 25 to 34 years comprised 23.5 percent.

*Status*

The labour force distribution by nationality status in Fall 2018 indicated that 47.1 percent were Caymanians, 44.2 percent were Non-Caymanians and 8.7 percent were PR-WRW (Table 8).

*Labour Force Participation Rate*

The overall labour force participation rate (LFPR)<sup>3</sup> was 85.3 percent (Table 9). Non-Caymanians overall had the highest labour force participation rate (94.2%) as expected due to the work permits oriented immigration system. Caymanian LFPR was 77.4%.

In the category of educational attainment, the labour force participation rate ranged from 26.7 percent among those with “none” to 92.0 percent among those with “college/university” education, thus higher educational attainments have the higher LFPRs.

By age, those from 25 to 54 years old have the highest LFPRs. The participation rate for females was lower than males in all of the educational attainment categories.

#### 4.3 EMPLOYED

The employed consists of those persons in the labour force who worked for pay, profit or family gain for at least one hour during the reference week, which was the week September 23 to 29, 2018. Persons who, for some reason or the other, did not work during the reference week, but had a job were also categorized as employed as such persons were temporarily absent from work. The number of employed persons was 44,887 (Table 10).

### *Sex and Age*

The number of employed males in the labour force was 22,401, less than the employed females, which numbered 22,486 (Table 10). Those in the 25 to 54 age groups accounted for 77.7 percent of the employed. Persons aged 15 to 24 years and the elderly (65+ years) represented 6.0 and 3.8 percent of the employed, respectively.

### *Status*

Employed Caymanians totalled 20,751 and accounted for 46.2 percent of the employed labour force. Employed Non-Caymanians and Permanent Residents WRW which combined accounted for 53.8 percent of the employed labour force combined totalled 20,292 and 3,843, respectively (Table 10).

### *Employment Status*

The employed persons are primarily “paid employees” (91.3%), while 8.5 percent were “self-employed,” i.e., they had their own business with or without employees. Among employed males, 11.4 percent were self-employed, while among females 5.6 percent were self-employed. Caymanians (15.8%) were more likely than Permanent Residents WRW (7.7%) and Non-Caymanians (1.2%) to have their own business (Tables 11 and 12).

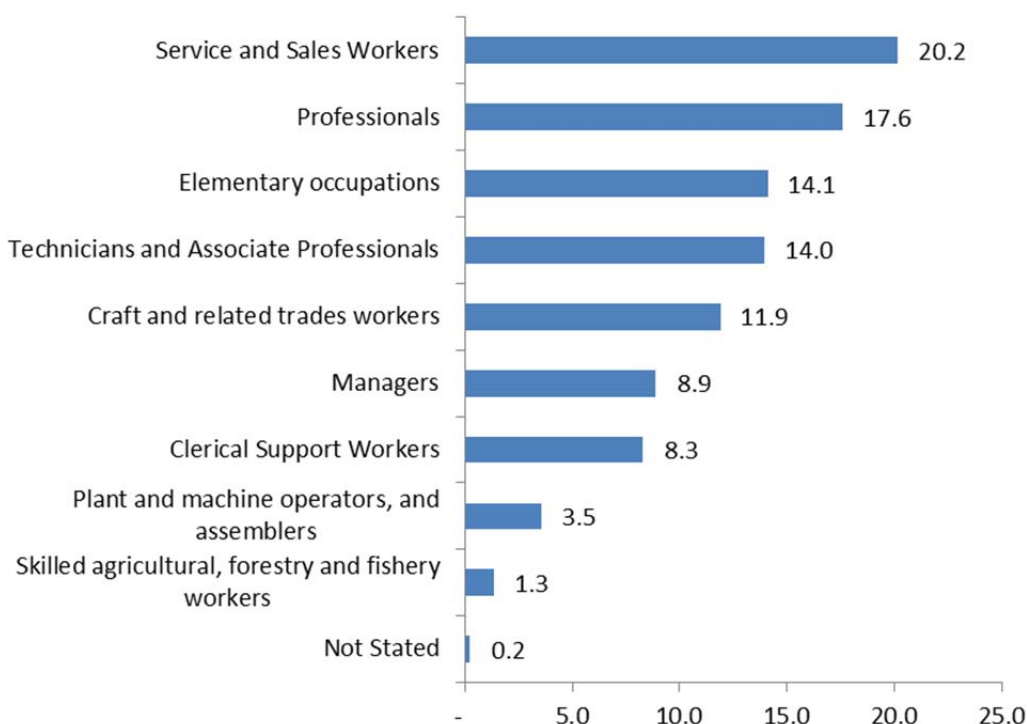

### Occupation

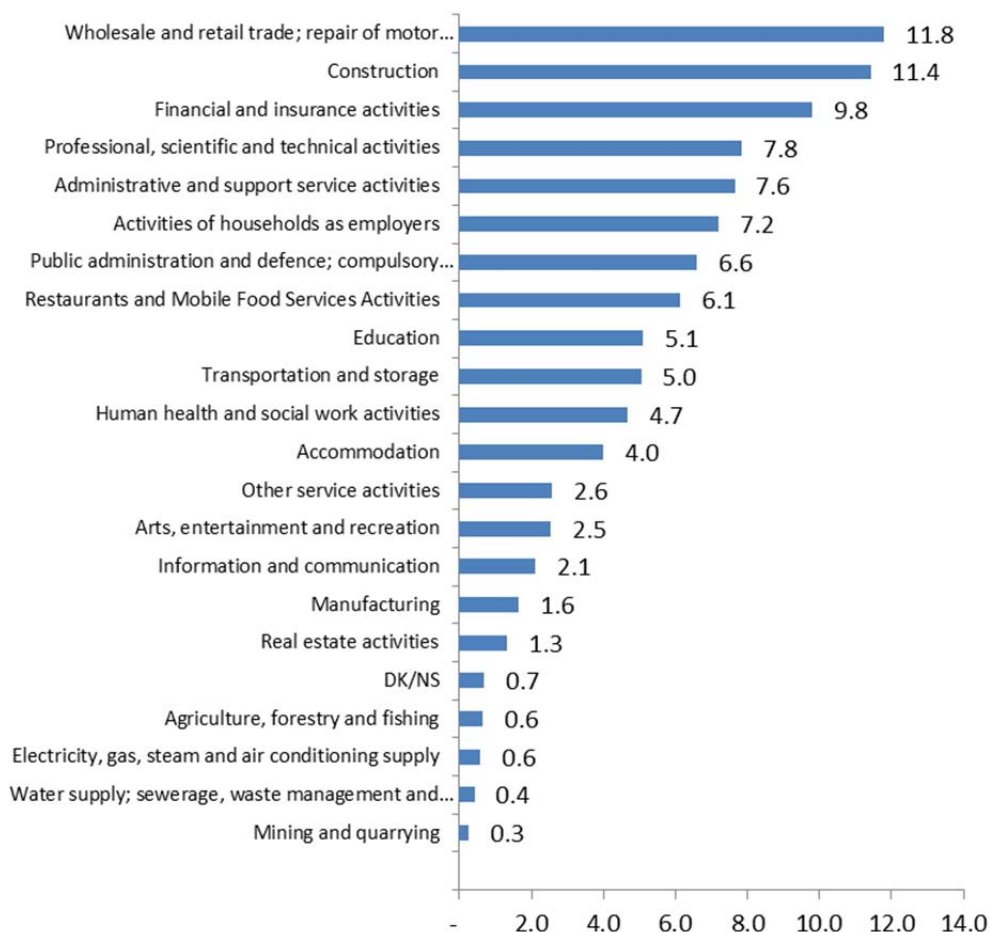
**Figure 2: Employment by Occupation Percentage Distribution, Fall 2018**

The top five occupations, which comprised 77.8 percent of total employment, were service and sales workers (20.2%); professionals (17.6%); elementary occupations (14.1%); technicians and associate professionals (14.0%) and craft and related trades workers (11.9%), (Figure 2). Analysis by sex and status indicates various trends. Most employed males worked as craft and related trades workers (22.2%); service and sales workers (15.7%); professionals (15.6%); elementary occupations (12.0%); and technicians and associate professionals (11.3%). Employed females worked mainly in service and sales workers (24.6%); professionals (19.6%); technicians and associate professionals (16.6%); and elementary occupations (16.2%) (Appendix Table 3.25).

Most employed Caymanians worked as technicians and associate professionals (19.8%); service and sales workers (15.5%); professionals (14.5%); clerical support workers (14.2%) and managers (13.6%). The leading occupations for Non-Caymanians are service and sales workers (25.3%); elementary occupations (22.3%); professionals (18.4%); and craft and related trades workers (15.6%). Permanent Residents WRW principally worked as professionals (30.1%); service and sales workers (18.2%); technicians and associate professionals (13.3%); and elementary occupations (11.9%). ## Industry

The top six industries accounted for 55.6 percent of the employed labour force, these were: wholesale and retail trade (11.8%); construction (11.4%); financial and insurance activities (9.8%); professional, scientific, and technical activities (7.8%); administrative and support service activities (7.6%); and activities of households as employers (7.2%); (see Figure 3).

## Hours of Work

Number of hours worked is defined as the number of hours worked during the reference period of September 23 to 29, 2018, by the respondent at his/her job(s), which includes all hours spent on work activities and overtime hours but excludes vacation leave, sick leave, public holidays and other forms of paid or unpaid leave.



The employed actually worked an average of 42.1 hours per week. On average, males worked more by 2.5 hours than females. Non-Caymanians had an average actual hours worked per week of 43.3 hours while Permanent Residents WRW for the same period worked 42.5 hours and Caymanians 40.9 hours. (Appendix Tables 3.31 and 3.32).

### *Earnings from Main Job*

Approximately 56.3 percent of employed persons earned CI\$2,400 or more per month (Tables 13 and 14). The proportion was higher among employed males (60.5%) compared to employed females (52.0%). Caymanians (68.7%) were more likely than Permanent Residents WRW (65.8%) and Non-Caymanians (41.6%) to have earned CI\$2,400 or more per month.

### *Employment by size of business*

Majority of the employed persons worked in large businesses with 50 or more employees (30.1%) and in micro business with one to five employees (26.7%). The highest proportion of Caymanians (34.2%) and Permanent Residents WRW (40.6%) were employed by large businesses. The highest proportion of Non-Caymanians (31.3%) was employed by micro businesses, closely followed by large businesses (24.0%).

### **4.3.1 UNDEREMPLOYED**

‘Underemployment’ is defined as ‘Involuntary part-time’ work, where workers who could (and would like to) be working for a full work-week can find only part-time work. The underemployed accounted for 2.1 percent of the employed in Fall 2018 (Table 16). The underemployment rate for females was 2.4 percent while for males, it was 1.8 percent. Caymanians had an underemployment rate of 3.6 percent, Permanent Residents WRW had 1.4

percent and Non-Caymanians had 0.7 percent. Persons aged 65 and above have the highest underemployment rate (10.7%) along with those who have completed primary school and below education (6.9%), (Table 16).

#### 4.4 UNEMPLOYED

There were 1,291 unemployed persons, and the unemployment rate was 2.8 percent (Table 17a). The unemployed were mainly persons who were 15 to 24 years old (272). Among males (655), while 996 Caymanians were unemployed.

### *Sex, age and status*

The unemployed persons between ages 15 and 24 years comprised the highest segment of the unemployed (21.0%). The unemployment rate was also highest in this age group (9.1%). The unemployment rate for males (2.8%) and females (2.8%) were equal. Permanent Residents WRW had the highest unemployment rate of 4.7 percent; Caymanians had 4.6 percent and Non-Caymanians, 0.5 percent.

### *Educational attainment*

Majority of the unemployed (745) persons were high school graduates. High school graduates also comprised the largest number among the unemployed Caymanians 611 persons and Permanent Residents WRW 108 persons. (see Appendix Table 5.2).

As shown in Table 17b, among the unemployed Caymanians, those with college/university education and middle school education have unemployment rates of 1.6 percent and 2.4 percent, respectively. Persons with high school education have the highest unemployment rate of 7.1 percent.

Among the unemployed PR-WRW, persons who completed high school had an unemployment rate of 10.3 percent and those with post-secondary education had 6.3 percent. Among the Non-Caymanians, the highest unemployment rates were for persons who completed primary school and below education (5.3%).

#### *Reasons for not having work*

Majority of the unemployed persons (74.2%) stated “no work available,” as the main reason for being unemployed. This reason was also cited by most males (74.5%) and females (73.8%). Similar trends were also seen among Caymanians (77.3%) and Permanent Residents WRW (71.4%), most of the unemployed Non-Caymanians (50.0%) also have this reason for not having work (see Appendix Tables 5.8 and 5.9).

#### *Job search*

When asked about their main methods of job search, which was a multiple response question, the most popular responses among the unemployed were “send résumé” (63.3%) and “ask friends” (58.8%). Persons who were classified as “unemployed” also registered with the National Workforce Development Agency (NWDA) (48.8%) and contacted an employer (48.0%) (Appendix Tables 5.14 and 5.15).

#### *Prior work and period without work*

The majority (81.8%) of the unemployed stated they had previous jobs, of these only 23.0 percent have been without work for more than one year.

Among the unemployed Caymanians, 815 (81.8%) had previous jobs while 181 (18.2%) never had a job; 16.7 percent of those with previous jobs were unemployed for more than a year (Appendix Tables 5.16, and 5.17).

#### *Training*

Approximately six out of ten of the unemployed persons (61.1%) received training for a specific occupation (Appendix Table 5.26). Among unemployed Caymanians, 52.3 percent had training, while all the Non-Caymanians (100.0%) and Permanent Residents (85.7%) WRW had training.

### **4.5 PERSONS NOT IN THE LABOUR FORCE**

Those who were of working age (15 years and older) and not working, not available to work or did not seek work during the reference week were classified as not being in the labour force. A total of 7,972 persons were not in the labour force, the majority of whom were Caymanians (79.8%). Females accounted for 60.5 percent of the persons not in the labour force. Most of the persons outside the labour force were aged 65 years and older (40.5%) and those aged 15 –24 years old (31.8%)(Appendix Tables 6.1 and 6.2). Persons who had high school or lower level education (63.7%) made up the majority of those not in the labour force (Appendix Table 6.6).

When asked for the reasons for not working, most of the persons not in the labour force stated they were “retired/elderly” (39.5%) or “students/in training” (29.1%). Retirees and students also dominate the composition of the Caymanian sub-group. Permanent Residents WRW were mostly with “home/family duties” (40.0%), while Non-Caymanians outside the labour force were mostly “students in training” (40.0%) and with “home/family duties” (31.4%).

#### 4.5.1 POTENTIAL LABOUR FORCE

Based on the ILO definition, the potential labour force consists of all persons of working age (15 years and older) who, during the reference week, were neither employed nor unemployed and were either classified as unavailable jobseekers or available potential jobseekers. *Unavailable jobseekers* are persons who carried out activities to ‘seek employment’, were not ‘currently available’ but would become available within a subsequent short period. *Available potential jobseekers* are persons who did not carry out activities to ‘seek employment’, but wanted employment and were ‘currently available’.

Of the 7,972 persons who were not in the labour force, 583 persons were considered potential labour force, all of whom carried out job search for a job in the future but are not currently

available. Majority of these persons were Caymanians (82.7%) and aged 15 to 24 years (26.9%) (see Appendix Table 6.30).

## 5. OTHER FINDINGS

### 5.1 HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

The majority of households (48.4%) owned their homes, while 47.0 percent rented them (Table 20). Majority of the households had internet connectivity (84.9%), computer/laptops (69.4%), cable/satellite television (57.0%), and air-condition (94.1%). Notably only 30.1 percent have a land-line telephone, but almost all (99.1%) had at least one cell phone. Approximately, 10.9 percent has a domestic helper, and 53.8 percent of households reported having housing structure insurance.
