



THE CAYMAN ISLANDS' FOREIGN TRADE STATISTICS REPORT 2012

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1. INTRODUCTION

The Foreign Trade Statistics Report is produced by the Balance of Payments Unit of the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO). The statistics on imports are primarily obtained from the computerized records of the Customs Department as maintained by the Computer Services Department. These records are based on documents on the importation and exportation of goods as completed by importers, exporters or their agents who are required to record the appropriate statistical tariff code using the Cayman Islands Tariff Code (CITC). The CITC is based on the Harmonised System (Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System) of the Customs Cooperation Council (CCC) and the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC) Revision 3.

The task of the ESO is mainly to incorporate and check the credibility of the data, and classify them into tables that can be useful for analysis. The process of classification is a time-intensive, laborious task as there have been a significant number of goods that are not classified or mis-classified. The objective of the classification process has been to minimize the number of such cases; over the years, the value of commodities that are not classified by SITC codes has diminished.

In addition to the classification by SITC codes, ESO also classifies all imported commodities by Broad Economic Category (BEC) based on international guidelines issued by the United Nations (UN).

ESO compiles exports data mainly from external sources namely, the US Census Bureau, the Statistical Institute of Jamaica and the UK Trade Data Online website. Exports data taken from the Customs Department are used to complement these.

2. EXPLANATORY NOTES AND DEFINITIONS

2.1 Trade Classification Systems

The Cayman Islands' version of the Harmonized System of Classification is the primary classification standard used for the Cayman Islands' foreign trade. In addition, the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC) Rev 3, which is the classification of international trade issued by the United Nations (UN), is used for the compilation of both the imports and exports of goods. Finally, the classification of imports by Broad Economic Categories (BEC) is based on international standards recommended by the UN.

2.2 System of Trade

The "General Trade System" is the system of coverage used in the tabulation of merchandise in this report. Under this system, all goods entering the Cayman Islands are recorded as imports while all goods leaving the country are recorded as exports.

2.3 Coverage

This report covers merchandise trade only. Trade in services are not included.

Included in the import and export statistics in this publication are goods sent abroad and returned for repair and goods re-exported as incorrect or faulty since they cannot be easily identified at the time of import. Excluded are goods in transit or other trans-shipments not destined for the Cayman Islands market, monetary gold and bullion, bank notes and coins in circulation; and parcel post exports for which no records are kept. Goods brought into the country directly by residents but are not declared are also excluded by default for lack of documentation.

The values recorded for imports and exports over a particular period represent the documents brought to account by Customs during that period. They may also include some goods actually arriving towards the end of the previous period but are accounted for in the current period.

Exports statistics cover both re-exports and domestic exports. Re-exports, which comprise the larger part of exports, are goods of foreign origin which have not been materially transformed while in the Cayman Islands. Domestic exports include goods produced in the country, extracted from its natural resources or manufactured in the country. These include goods of foreign origin which have been assembled or transformed in the country.

2.4 Valuation

All values are shown in Cayman Islands dollars (CI\$). Imports are valued at cost, insurance and freight (c.i.f) which is the value up to the time of delivery at the port. It includes incidental charges but excludes customs or any other duty paid on arrival.

Exports are valued at free on board (f.o.b), that is the value at which goods were sold by the exporters, and it includes all local charges to the exporting vessel or aircrafts. Freight and insurance are not included.

2.5 Revisions

The imports data for the year 2011 have been revised, largely as a consequence of corrections on previous errors, omissions, misclassifications as reflected in the updated entries of the Customs computer system.

2.7 Limitations

In the Cayman Islands, a number of importers do not provide codes, or provide improper codes. Over the years, this issue required the ESO to vigilantly verify codes and provide missing ones. ESO continues to review the imports data with the aim of improving the accuracy, reliability and proper classification of the data.

Given the volume of imports, full details of the quantity and value of all imports are not available. This will require an upgrade of the current administrative system based at the Cayman Islands Customs Department. At present, only a small proportion of commodities have both quantity and value of imports.

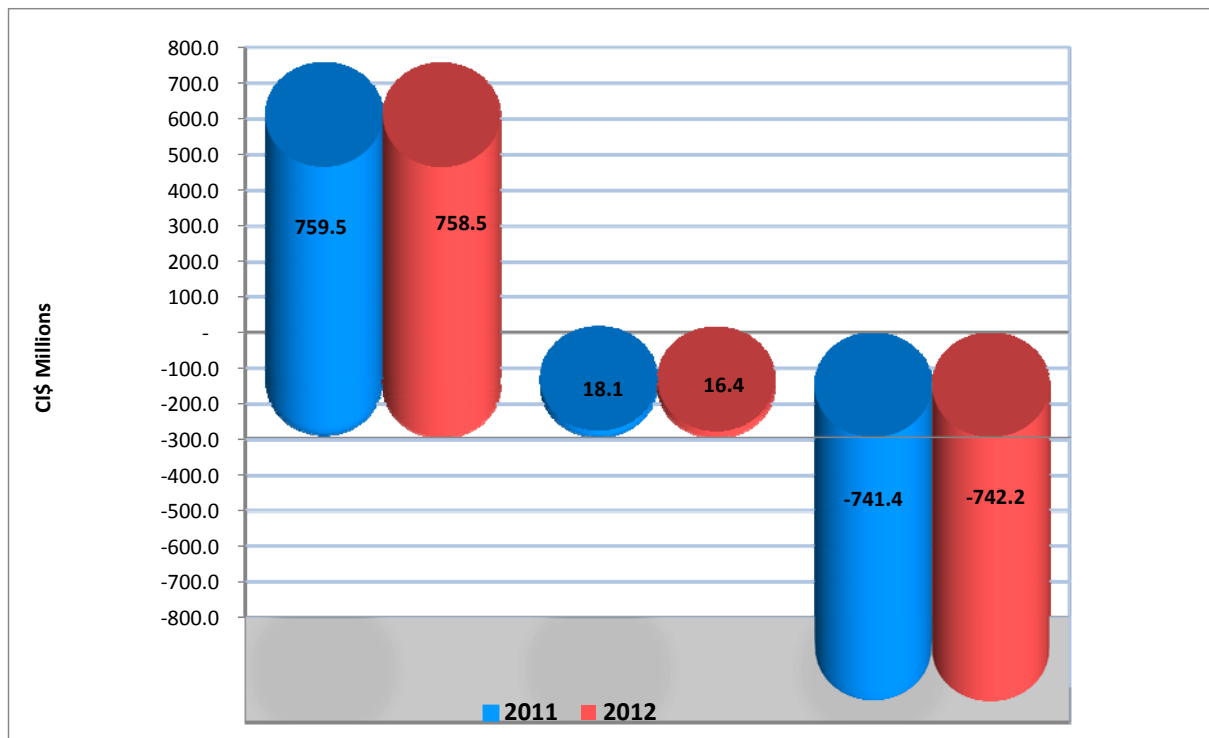
3. COMMENTARY ON TRADE 2012

3.1 Visible trade balance

In 2012, the balance of visible trade was in deficit amounting to CI\$742.2 million. This resulted from total imports of CI\$758.5 million which overwhelmingly outweighed exports (CI\$16.4 million). Among the categories of traded goods, the top three contributors of the trade deficit were: (a) mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (CI\$155.1 million); (b) food and live animals (CI\$127.1 million); (c) machinery and transport equipment (CI\$115.0 million) (see Table 1.1).

The visible trade deficit in 2012 was slightly higher compared to the CI\$741.4 recorded in 2011. Both imports and exports of goods fell, with the level of exports falling (-9.5%) at a faster pace than imports (-0.1%). The decline in imports was largely a reflection of the decrease in the value of oil-related imports (see Table 1.2 and Chart 1).

Chart 1: Visible Trade Balance, 2011 and 2012

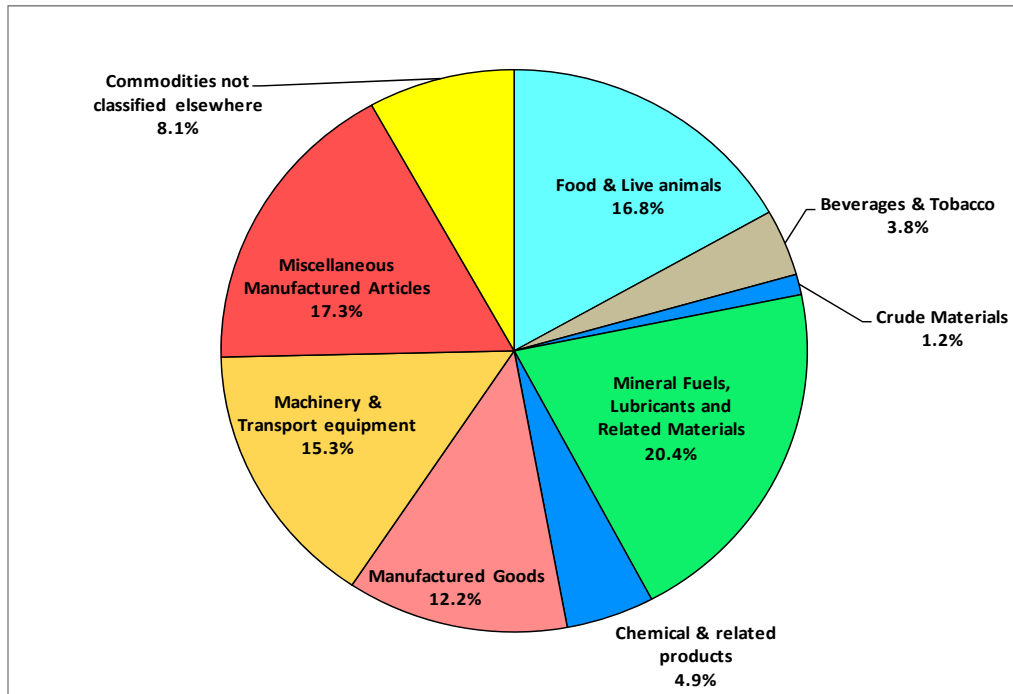


3.2 Imports

In 2012, the total value of all goods imported fell marginally by 0.1 percent to reach CI\$758.5 million, compared to CI\$759.5 million recorded in 2011 (see Tables 2.1 to 2.7). The decline is due to petroleum products which fell by 15.9 percent to \$151.9 million. In contrast, the total value of non-petroleum imports increased by 4.8 percent, reaching CI\$606.6 million.

Most of the imports in 2012 were accounted for by mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials, followed by food and live animals, and machinery and transport equipment (see Chart 2). These three categories comprise 52.5 percent of all imports.

Imports by category of goods

Chiefly influencing the performance of imports in 2012 was the drop in mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials from \$180.5 million in 2011 to \$151.9 million. This is traced mainly to the decline in the quantity of motor gas, diesel and aviation fuel coupled with the fall in the average price of these items.

Other decreases were also recorded in imports of animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes (-37.2%), as well as commodities and transactions not elsewhere classified (-12.3%).

Increases were recorded for food and live animals; beverages and tobacco; chemical and related products; manufactured goods classified chiefly by materials and machinery and transport equipment.

The 7.0 percent increase in the food and live animals category largely reflects increases in the importation of live animals (except fish); meat and meat preparations; dairy products and eggs; and vegetables and fruits. On the other hand, the importation of miscellaneous edible products fell 14.1 percent.

Imports of beverages and tobacco recorded an increase of 5.8 percent with beverages increasing by 6.4 percent to a value of CI\$25.2 million. Imports of tobacco products increased by 1.6 percent to CI\$3.7 million.

The chemical and related products category saw an increase of 14.3 percent, largely on account of essential oils, perfume and toiletry products (15.0%) and medicinal and pharmaceutical products (8.6%), while organic chemicals declined by 30.3 percent.

Manufactured goods classified chiefly by materials showed an increase of 19.9 percent. Accounting for this movement was a rise in textile yarn, fabrics and related materials (70.2%), rubber manufactures (18.7%), non-metal mineral manufactures (17.5%), and paper and paper products (16.9%). However, iron and steel products and non-ferrous metals recorded a decrease of 26.9 percent and 25.5 percent respectively.

The machinery and transport equipment category grew by 7.2 percent, largely fuelled by increases in the sub-categories of road vehicles (14.8%), electrical machinery and apparatus (12.7%), office machines (11.3%), and general industrial machinery and equipment (8.6%). However, power generating machinery and equipment and specialized machinery fell by 24.2 percent and 7.3 percent respectively.

Largely influencing the 12.3 percent drop in commodities and transactions not elsewhere classified was the significant fall in the importation of coins (other than gold coins) not being of legal tender (-88.3%) and the 22.2 percent drop in items imported via the airport and courier. On the other hand, increases were recorded in postal packages and gold bullion and coins.

Imports by country of origin

The USA continues to be the dominant trading partner of the Cayman Islands accounting for 89.4 percent of total imports with a value of CI\$678.0 million in 2012, compared to CI\$689.1 million in 2011. Imports from the United Kingdom increased by over 100 percent to reach \$12.1 million in 2012, or 1.6 percent of all imports. Jamaica accounted for \$9.6 million (or 1.3 percent) of total imports, higher by 76.8 percent improvement compared to 2011. Goods sourced from Mexico also rose by over 100 percent to CI\$3.1 million (or 0.4% of total imports). Notable declines in imports were those from Switzerland and Germany.

Imports by broad economic category

An analysis of imports by broad economic classification (BEC) reveals that all categories grew with the exception of fuel and lubricants and goods not elsewhere specified (see Table 2.7). Reflecting the rise in construction activity in 2012, capital goods rose 10.7 percent. Transport equipment, and industrial supplies not elsewhere specified also grew by more than 10 percent.

3.3 Exports

In 2012, total exports, which comprise largely of re-exports, fell by 9.5 percent to \$16.4 million compared to the CI\$18.1 million in 2011 (see Table 3.1). All export categories showed a decrease with the exception of food and live animals which recorded a significant increase of 108.2 percent.

For the same period, commodities and transactions not elsewhere classified which are mostly the re-exports of personal effects continued to dominate as these contributed 72.6 percent of the total exports, while crude materials contributed 10.9 percent.
