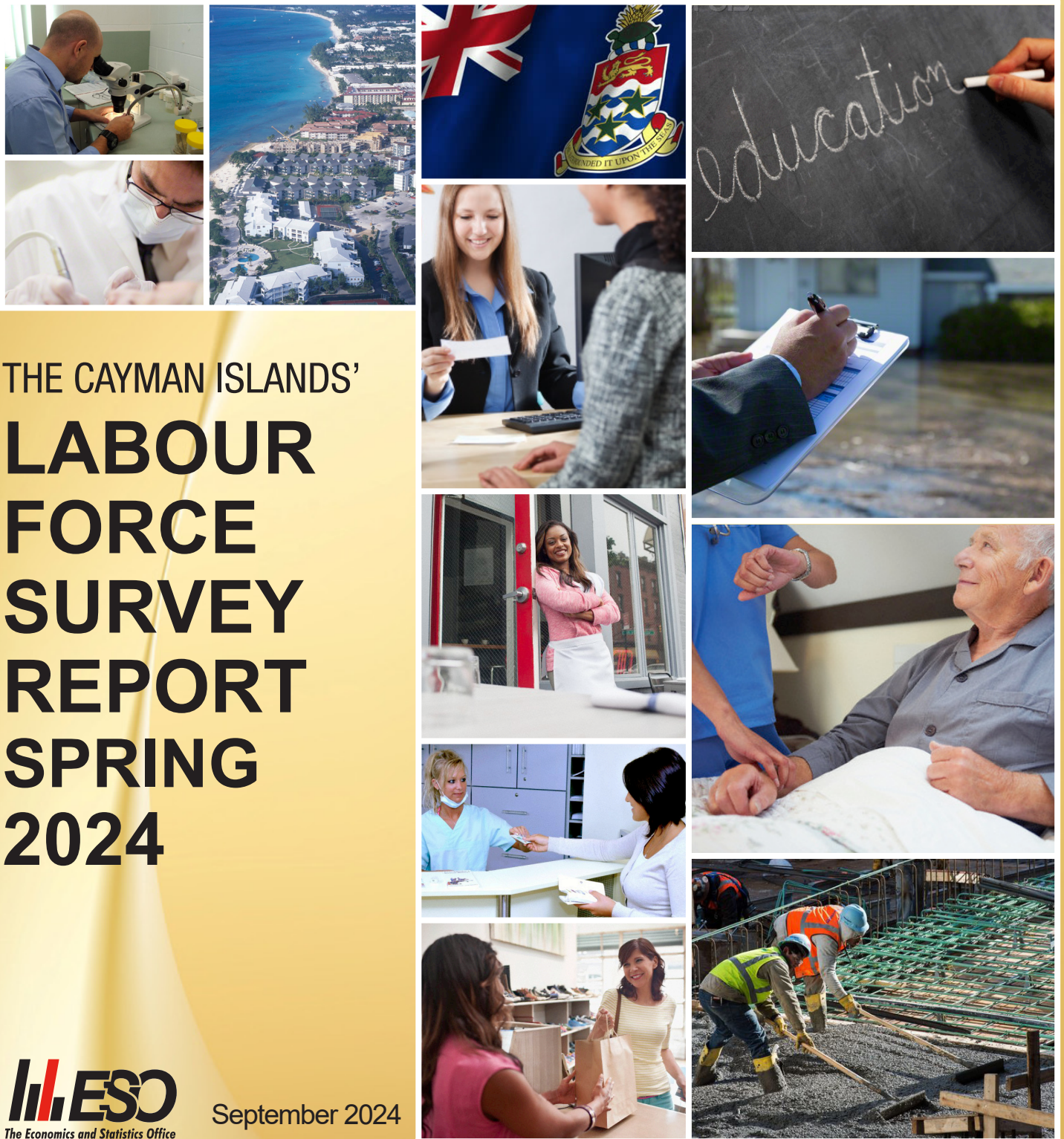

## 1. INTRODUCTION

This report presents the findings of the Spring 2024 Labour Force Survey (LFS). The LFS mainly provides information on the characteristics of persons in the labour force (employed and unemployed). It also presents demographic information on the general population, some characteristics of persons not in the labour force as well as household characteristics.

The concepts used in the Survey are in accordance with the International Labour Organization (ILO) guidelines, and therefore, the indicators produced from the Survey are comparable to those used internationally.

The remaining sections of this Report present the methodology, the main findings with emphasis on the characteristics of the labour force and those that are out of the labour force, and other findings on housing characteristics. The Appendix presents the detailed tables.

## 2. METHODOLOGY

As in previous LFS, planning and execution of the Spring 2024 LFS was undertaken by the staff of the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO), a department in the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development of the Cayman Islands Government.

### Sampling design

The sampling frame for the LFS is the ESO's Household Register, which is a listing of all household dwelling units in the Cayman Islands. The last update of the Register was conducted in April 2021. Updates were also based on information from the 2021 Population and Housing Census. As of January 25, 2022, the Register listed 29,699 household dwelling units, which is the sampling frame used for this edition of the LFS.

Samples for the LFS were drawn from all districts of the Cayman Islands. Cayman Brac and Little Cayman were combined to form the stratum Sister Islands. Probability proportionate to household count by district, as determined from the ESO Household Register, was used when allocating the number of selected households across strata. Households were randomly selected from all six districts; within each district, the households were selected with equal probability. The probability of selection for the sampled households in each district can be expressed as follows:

$$P_h = m_h / M_h$$

Where:

$P_h$  = probability of selection for the sample households in the h-th stratum (district)

$M_h$  = total number of households in the sample frame for the h-th stratum

$m_h$  = the number of sample households selected in the h-th stratum

Based on the sampling design, a sample of 2,000 household addresses was randomly selected, representing 6.7 percent of the 29,699 households.

**Fieldwork**

Since the October 2014 LFS, the ESO has been using tablets for electronic data collection in Grand Cayman. Included in the Appendix (see page 164) is a copy of the questionnaire that was uploaded to the tablet for this edition of the LFS.

The reference week for the Spring 2024 LFS was the week 21<sup>st</sup> April to 27<sup>th</sup> April 2024. The data collection took place over a six-week period from 28<sup>th</sup> April to 16<sup>th</sup> June 2024. The administrative data (births, deaths, and work permit) as of the end of June 2024, which were used in estimating the total population, were collected in early-July 2024.

The ESO hosted its usual in-person training exercise to prepare for the fieldwork. A total of 50 persons, including ESO survey staff, were recruited in Grand Cayman, most of whom have prior household survey experience (census and/or LFS). In the Sister Islands (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman), two persons were recruited to administer the LFS using the questionnaires on tablets. Therefore, a total of 52 persons were eventually selected to conduct interviews in the Cayman Islands.

**Weights**

The 2024 population estimate was derived by adding the natural increase (births minus deaths) data collected from the Health Services Authority and immigration (work permits, permanent residents and change of status) from the Cayman Islands Customs and Border Control (CBC) Department in the first six months of 2024 compared to the 2023 year-end population estimate.

The raising factors for Caymanian, PR/PR-WRW, and Non-Caymanian sub-populations were then calculated based on their respective population estimates,

$$\text{Raising factor}_{si} = \frac{\text{Population}_{si}}{\text{Survey Count}_{si}}$$

Where:

$\text{Population}_{si}$  = estimated population based on administrative data of status<sub>*i*</sub>  
(<sub>*i*</sub>=Caymanian, Permanent Residents, and Non-Caymanians)

$\text{Survey Count}_{si}$  = number of individuals from the LFS per status.

The household characteristics were raised using the district response rates adjusted for non-responses at the household level.

### Data processing

The survey returns were processed internally by ESO staff members. Data capture was built into the ESO Mobile LFS Project (LFSPRJ) software on tablets. Coding of industries and occupations were also conducted internally using the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC) (Rev. 4) and the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO) 2008, respectively. Edit checks were conducted using CSPRO (Census and Survey Processing System) and SPSS (Statistical Package for the Social Sciences). Data were verified with cross-referencing information stored on the tablets or by phone calls to the respondent. A data file was then created with information from all households who completed the LFS interview (fully and partially). Finally, indicators were generated from this file using SPSS, and the final tables presented in this Report were prepared using Excel.

### Standard errors for main estimates

Given the nature of the sample design used in the LFS, the estimates were computed with a 2.5 percent margin of error. The estimates published in this Report's tables are rounded to the nearest whole number or person. The sum of the individual rounded numbers may not equal the total. In addition, the difference of one person for the same category in different tables is due to rounding.

Data representing the weighted responses of one individual in the Survey are suppressed and indicated by the symbol "...".

The estimates presented in this Report are all liable to sampling error. Their absolute sampling error increases with their magnitude, while the relative error decreases the greater the size of

the estimate. Generally, the smaller the *Relative Standard Error* (or *Coefficient of Variation*), the more reliable is the estimate. Because of this, comparisons of the larger estimates may be used with confidence, but small estimates must be treated with caution. The *standard errors*, *confidence intervals*, and *coefficients of variation* (C.V.) of the estimates for key variables for the Spring 2024 LFS are shown in Tables 2 and 3.

### 3. DEFINITION OF KEY CONCEPTS

#### ***Population***

In the LFS, population means the “resident” population; that is, persons staying or intending to stay in the Cayman Islands for at least six months. Visitors/tourists are not included in the resident population. Persons in institutions for more than six months are excluded. Family members of resident households who were abroad at the time of the survey but had intentions to return to the Islands were also considered residents.

The population is categorised into three sub-populations by immigration status: Caymanians, Permanent Residents (PR), and Non-Caymanians. Permanent Residents include Non-Caymanians married to Caymanians, Permanent Residents with a government contract, Permanent Residents with rights to work (PR-WRW), and Permanent Residents without rights to work.

#### ***Labour Force***

The labour force comprises members of the non-institutionalised population (i.e., those not in residential institutions such as general penitentiary and retirement homes) 15 years of age and over who were employed or unemployed during the reference week. All persons in the PR labour force in all tables and sections of this Report refer explicitly to PR-WRW only. Persons categorised as PR without rights to work are included as part of the Non-Caymanian Working Age Population.

#### ***Employed***

Employed persons are those who, during the reference week, did any work for pay or profit; that is, paid work in the context of an employer-employee relationship or self-employment. It also includes unpaid family workers who contributed directly to the operation of a farm, business, or professional practice owned or operated by a related member of the household. Based on the International Labour Organization (ILO) guidelines, work can be for as little as an hour during the reference week; it excludes unpaid domestic housework and volunteer work but includes those temporarily away from their jobs.



**Unemployed**

Unemployed persons are those who, during the reference week, are:

- (a) without work;
- (b) currently available for work and
- (c) actively looking for a job, or had definite arrangements to start a job within 4 weeks.

**Unemployment Rate**

The unemployment rate represents the number of unemployed persons expressed as a percentage of the labour force. The unemployment rate for a particular group (age, status, sex, etc.) is the number of unemployed people in that group, which is expressed as a percentage of the labour force for that group.

$$\text{Unemployment Rate} = \frac{\text{Number of Unemployed}}{\text{Labour Force}} \times 100$$

**Not in the Labour Force**

These are persons in the non-institutional population (i.e., those not in residential institutions such as general penitentiary or retirement homes)—15 years of age and over—who were neither employed nor unemployed during the reference week.

**Household**

A household comprises either one person living alone or a group of persons (not necessarily related) living at the same address, with common housekeeping, i.e., sharing at least one meal a day and sharing living arrangements. This concept is used for persons sharing an apartment or house or a one-room together. For further clarification, please see:

#### 4. MAIN FINDINGS

The population of the Cayman Islands was estimated at 87,866, consisting of 39,897 Caymanians, 7,822 Permanent Residents (including 6,288 WRW), and 40,147 non-Caymanians. Among them, 62,743 individuals comprised the labour force, with 61,003 employed and 1,740 unemployed. These findings result in an overall labour force participation rate of 83.6 percent, which varied by sex and status. The unemployment rate stood at 2.8 percent, varying by status and sex (see Tables 4 and 5). Figure 1 illustrates the population and labour force composition.

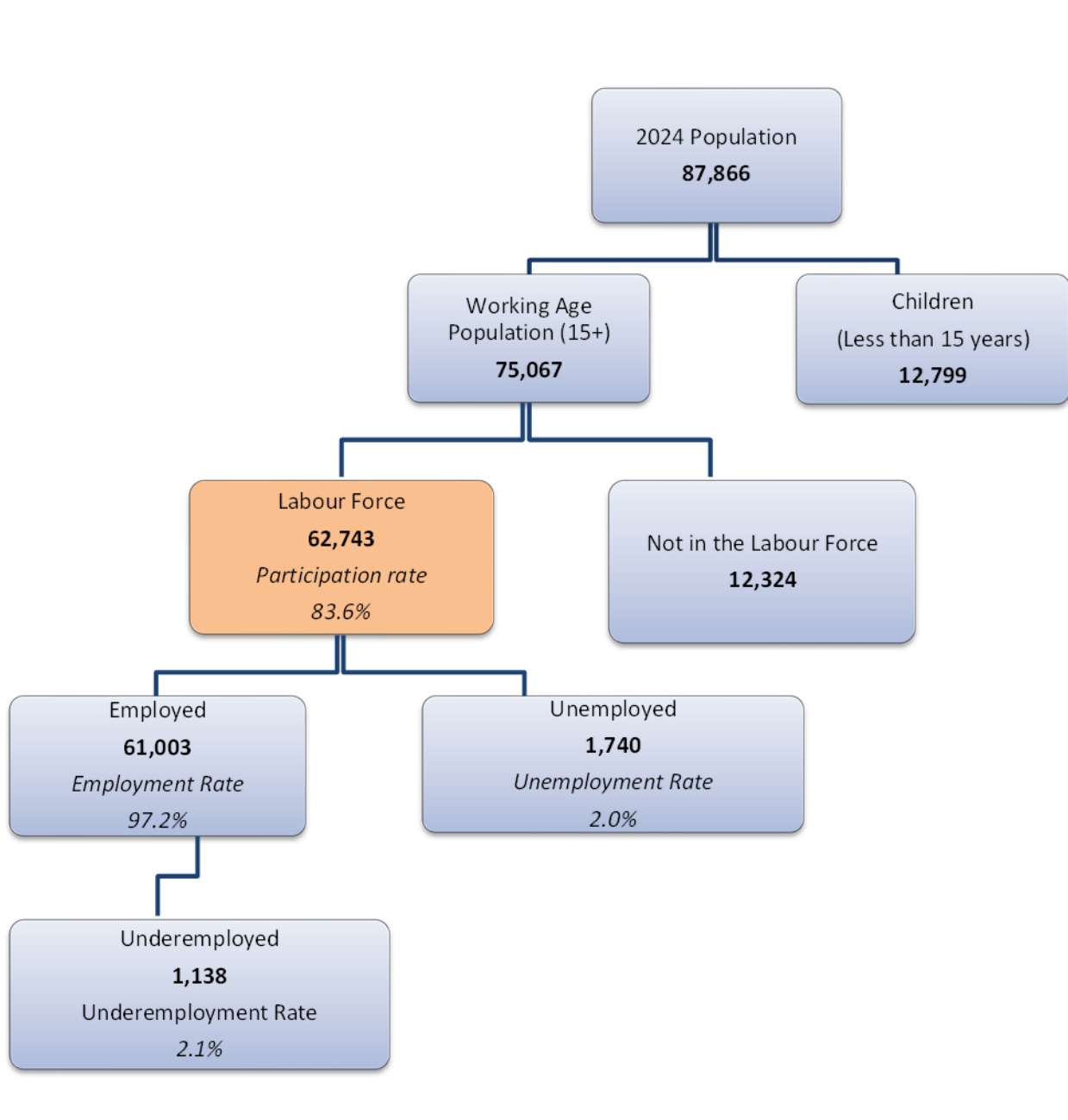

### 4.1 POPULATION ESTIMATES

The mid-year population of the Cayman Islands was estimated at 87,866 for the period ending June 2024. Most of the population resides in Grand Cayman, with a concentration in George Town, accounting for 50.3 percent of the total population. This was followed by West Bay, covering 22.0 percent of the population, and Bodden Town, with 20.3 percent. In contrast, smaller portions of the population reside in North Side and East End, accounting for 2.3 and 1.8 percent, respectively. In addition, the population of the Sister Islands (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman) accounted for 3.2 percent (see Table 6).

The average household size was recorded at 2.34 persons. Bodden Town and North Side exhibited the highest average household sizes, registering 2.68 and 2.56, respectively. In contrast, the Sister Islands demonstrated the smallest average household size, with a figure of 1.94 persons.

### Sex and Age

In Spring 2024, the estimated population had a sex distribution of 51.1 percent males and 48.9 percent females (see Table 7).

Children under the age of 15 made up 14.6 percent of the population, while the elderly (aged 65 years and older) made up 8.1 percent. Collectively termed as the 'dependent population,' these two age groups accounted for 22.7 percent of the overall population.

The working-age population, representing those persons 15 years and older, accounted for 85.3 percent. This group typically engages in employment or job-seeking, marking their 'productive years'. Within this category, persons aged 15 to 64 are recognised as the main providers of support for the dependent population (children and the elderly). The relationship between these dependent groups and the 15- to 64-year-old cohort results in a dependency ratio of 29.4 percent.

*Status*

Non-Caymanians made up the largest proportion of the population, accounting for 45.7 percent, while Caymanians and Permanent Residents had a population share of 45.4 and 8.9 percent, respectively. Compared to Spring 2023, the Caymanian population increased by 2.5 percent (see Table 7).

Among Caymanians, the working-age population accounted for 81.2 percent, while 86.8 percent of Non-Caymanians were of working age. The entirety of the Permanent Resident population was of working age. (see Appendix Table 1.5). Higher percentages among the two latter groups are expected, given that the residency of most expatriates is contingent upon work permits.



## 4.2 LABOUR FORCE

The labour force is represented by persons of working age (15 years and older) who worked, as well as those who, at the time of the survey, did not have a job but were available and looking for work during the reference period. The Spring 2024 LFS counted 62,743 persons in the labour force (see Table 8).

### *Sex and age*

In Spring 2024, males constituted 52.7 percent of the labour force, while females accounted for the remaining 47.3 percent. In terms of age distribution, the labour force was mainly composed of individuals aged 35 to 44 (28.7%), followed by those aged 25 to 34 (24.4%) and individuals aged 45 to 54 (22.1%) (see Table 8).

*Status*

The labour force distribution by nationality status showed that 37.2 percent were Caymanians, 53.5 percent were Non-Caymanians, and 9.3 percent were PR-WRW (see Table 8).

*Labour Force Participation Rate*

Table 9 shows the sex distribution of the labour force participation rate across various demographic attributes, specifically nationality status, age, and education. The total labour force participation rate (LFPR) was recorded at 83.6 percent (see Table 9). Permanent Residents WRW displayed the highest labour force participation rates at 93.0 percent. The LFPR of Non-Caymanians closely followed with a rate of 92.3 percent. This outcome aligns with expectations, considering the work permit-oriented immigration system. In contrast, Caymanians had the lowest LFPR at 72.0 percent.

Further analysis by educational attainment levels, revealed that the labour force participation rate ranged from 36.7 percent among those with “primary and below” to 91.7 percent among those with “college/university” education.

A review of age-specific LFPRs revealed that persons 25 to 54 were the most likely to be employed or looking for work. The age-specific LFPRs ranged from 86.3 percent among persons 55 - 64 years to 95.6 percent among those 25 to 34 years of age. Further analysis showed that males (86.2%) had higher rates of labour force participation than females (80.8%). This trend was consistent when considering educational attainment as well, with males displaying greater LFPRs across all levels of education compared to females.

**4.3 EMPLOYED**

The term "employed" includes individuals within the labour force who worked for compensation, profit, or familial benefit for a minimum of one hour during the reference week, April 21st to April 27th, 2024. Additionally, individuals who held a job but did not work during the reference week were also classified as employed, recognising their temporary absence. A total of 61,003 persons were employed in Spring 2024 (see Table 10).

*Sex and Age*

The employed labour force consisted of more males than females , with a count of 32,243 (52.9%) compared to 28,760 (47.1%), respectively (see Table 10). The majority of the employed labour force consisted of individuals aged 25 to 64 years, accounting for 90.1 percent. In contrast, individuals aged 15 to 24 years and the elderly (65 years and older) made up for 9.8 percent of the employed labour force collectively (see Table 10).

*Status*

A total of 22,181 Caymanians accounted for 36.4 percent of the employed labour force. Non-Caymanians and PR-WRW accounted for 54.3 and 9.3 of the employed labour force, respectively (see Table 10).

*Employment Status*

Most of the employed labour force (91.6%) “worked for someone”. Self-employed persons, including business owners with and without employees, accounted for 8.1 percent of the employed labour force. Among employed males, 11.3 percent were self-employed compared to 4.6 percent among females (see Table 11). Furthermore, Caymanians (16.7%) were most likely to own a business In comparison to Permanent Residents WRW (12.8%) and Non-Caymanians (1.5%) (see Table 12).

### Occupation

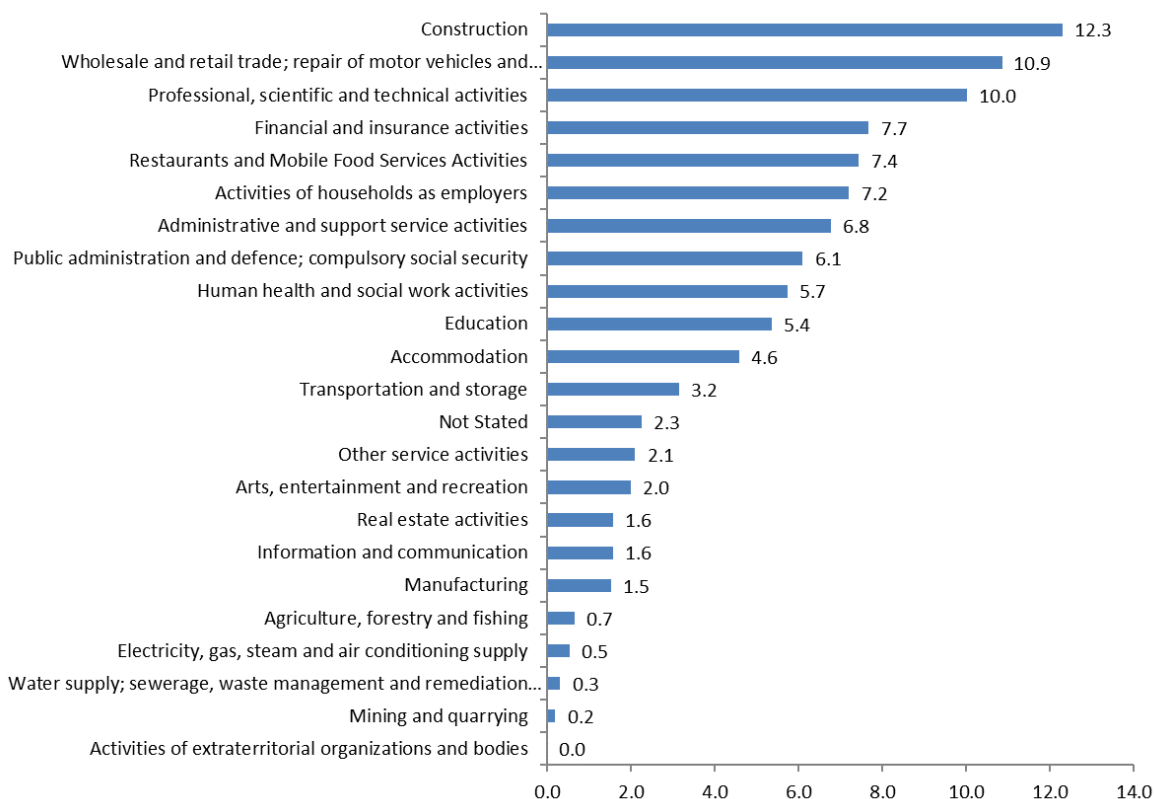
Figure 2: Employment by Occupation Percentage Distribution, Spring 2024

The top five occupations, accounting for 77.5 percent of total employment, were professionals (19.7%), service and sales workers (18.2%), elementary occupations (13.7%), craft and related trades workers (13.2%), and managers (12.7%) (see Figure 2).

Further analysis by sex revealed that the majority of employed males were occupied as craft and related trades workers (23.9%); professionals (17.9%); managers (13.3%); service and sales workers (12.4%); and elementary occupations (10.2%). In contrast, employed females were primarily occupied as service and sales workers (24.7%), professionals (21.7%), elementary occupations (17.5%), technicians and associate professionals (13.0%), and managers (12.1%) (see Appendix Table 3.36).

Leading occupations among employed Caymanians were managers (20.7%), professionals (19.6%), technicians and associate professionals (14.3%), service and sales workers (11.3%) and clerical support workers (10.9%). Non-Caymanians were mainly occupied as service and sales workers (22.6%), elementary occupations (19.3%), professionals (18.9%), craft and related workers (17.2%), and technicians and associate professionals (8.5%). Permanent Residents WRW most commonly worked as professionals (24.7%), service and sales workers (19.2%), managers (17.8%), technicians and associate professionals (16.9%), and craft and related workers (8.2%) (see Appendix Table 3.37).

*Industry*

The top six industries accounted for 55.5 percent of the employed labour force. These industries were: construction (12.3%); wholesale and retail trade (10.9%); professional, scientific, and technical activities (10.0%); financial and insurance activities (7.7%); restaurants and mobile food services activities (7.4%) and activities of households as employers (7.2%) (see Figure 3).

### Hours of Work

The number of hours worked is defined as the number of hours worked during the reference period of April 21<sup>st</sup> to April 27<sup>th</sup>, 2024, by the respondent at his/her job(s), which includes all hours spent on work activities and overtime hours but excludes vacation leave, sick leave, public holidays and other forms of paid or unpaid leave.

On average, employed persons worked 43.3 hours per week. Further analysis indicated that males worked an average of 2.1 hours more than females. Further breakdown by status revealed that Caymanians worked 41.8 hours per week, while Permanent Residents WRW and Non-Caymanians averaged 43.5 and 44.3 hours per week, respectively (see Appendix Tables 3.40 and 3.41).

### Earnings from Main Job

Around 51.8 percent of employed individuals earned CI\$2,400 or more per month (see Tables 13 and 14). The proportion was higher among employed males (55.7%) than employed females (47.4%). While a higher proportion of Caymanians (62.5%) earned CI\$2,400 or more per month compared to Permanent Residents WRW (60.3%) and Non-Caymanians (43.1%).

#### *Employment by the size of business*

The vast majority of the employed labour force worked in large businesses with 50 or more employees (32.5%) and in micro-business with one to five employees (25.2%). This trend persisted when considering sex and status. The highest proportion of Caymanians (39.7%), Permanent Residents WRW (32.9%) and Non-Caymanians (27.7%) were employed by large businesses. Similarly, the majority of both males (32.7%) and females (32.2%) were also employed by large organisations.

### Training

A total of 17,143 (28.1%) employed persons stated that they had received educational training. A larger share of employed females received training (31.6%) in comparison to employed males (25.0%). By status, Caymanians (34.6%) had the highest percentage of persons who completed educational training, followed by Permanent Residents WRW (29.7%) and Non-Caymanians (23.5%). (see Appendix Table 3.8). Regarding occupation-related training, the majority of employed persons (64.2) stated that they had received it (see Appendix Table 3.9).

The majority of employed persons (65.0%) cited that they had not received any personal development training. Further breakdown by status showed that amongst those who had completed personal development training, the most prominent training program was the Certified First Aid training with 20.4 percent of Caymanians, 19.2 of Non-Caymanians and 19.7 percent of Permanent Residents WRW completing this program (see Appendix Table 3.17).

### *Promotion at current job*

When asked if they had received a promotion at their current job, 13,500 (22.1%) of employed persons stated that they had received a promotion. By status, Caymanians had the highest percentage of persons who received a promotion (33.8%), followed by Permanent Residents WRW (26.0%) and Non-Caymanians (13.6%) (see Appendix Table 3.18).

Among those persons who received a promotion at their current job, the majority of persons (77.4%) received their most recent promotion within the last four years. By status, 91.3 of non-Caymanians received their promotion within the last four years followed by Caymanians (70.3%) and Permanent residents WRW (70.3%) (see Appendix Table 3.20).

The majority of persons indicated that they had received both more responsibilities and higher pay with their promotion (79.5%). By sex, 79.8 percent of females and 79.1 percent of males received both more responsibilities and higher pay (see Appendix Table 3.21). Further analysis by status shows that 86.0 percent of Permanent Residents WRW, 81.7 percent of Caymanians and 73.6 percent of Non-Caymanians also responded “more responsibilities and higher pay”. In contrast, 4.6 percent of Non-Caymanians and 3.0 percent of Caymanians only received higher pay with their promotion (see Appendix Table 3.22)

Among persons who did not receive a promotion, “no opportunity for promotion” was the most common reason given (64.2%). This trend remained consistent among males (63.4%) and females (65.1%) (see Appendix Table 3.23). Similarly, 67.2 percent of non-Caymanians, 64.2 of permanent residents WRW and 58.2 percent of Caymanians were also given the reason “no opportunity for promotion” when they did not receive a promotion (see Appendix Table 3.24).

### **4.3.1 UNDEREMPLOYED**

Underemployment not only occurs when workers who could (and would like to) be working for a full work week can only find part-time work, but it can also occur when workers take on employment that does not utilize all their skills and education. As a result, two different measures of underemployment have been utilized; the time measure and the skills and education measure.

#### *Time measure*

The underemployed accounted for 1.9 percent of the employed in Spring 2024 (see Table 16). By sex, this rate stood at 1.8 percent among males and 1.9 percent among females. A breakdown by status showed that Caymanians had an underemployment rate of 2.9 percent, whereas Permanent Residents WRW and Non-Caymanians had rates of 2.3 percent and 1.1 percent, respectively. The highest rates of underemployment were observed among individuals aged 15 to 24 (4.5%) and those with primary and below education levels (3.7%), followed by those aged 55 to 64 (2.9%) (see Table 16).

*Education and skills measure*

The majority of employed persons felt that their qualifications exactly matched their current job (73.1%). Dissimilarly, 24.4 percent of Non-Caymanians felt that they were overqualified for their current post, followed by 21.5 percent of Permanent Residents WRW and 18.0 percent of Caymanians (see Appendix Table 4.25).

In terms of education and experience, the majority of persons felt that their education, training and experience is exactly related to their current job (48.3%). By sex, more males (50.1%) felt that their education, training and experience was exactly related to their current job than females (46.3%) (see Appendix Table 4.28). Further disaggregation by status also reveals that “exactly related” was the top response across all nationality statuses, most notably permanent residents WRW (53.0%) and Caymanians (48.9%) (see Appendix Table 4.29).

Persons who did not feel like their education, training, and experience were exactly related to their current job were asked to indicate whether or not they would prefer a job more related to their current education, training, and experience. A total of 12,059 (39.1%) persons answered affirmatively to this question. Despite this, many persons stated their preference for a job more closely related to their current job; only 28.5 percent of persons were actively seeking a job.

**4.4 UNEMPLOYED**

The unemployed labour force had a count of 1,740, yielding an unemployment rate of 2.8 percent (see Table 17a). The unemployed labour force mainly consisted of persons aged 25 to 34 (436 persons), accounting for 25.1 percent of the total unemployed. In terms of sex, a higher percentage of females (54.3%) were unemployed than males (45.7%). Additionally, the count of unemployed Caymanians reached 1,142 individuals, contributing to an unemployment rate of 4.9 percent.

#### *Sex, age, and status*

Unemployment by sex reveals that males had an unemployment rate of 2.4 percent, while females experienced a higher rate of 3.2 percent. An analysis of age-specific unemployment rates shows that persons aged 15 to 24 (10.7%) were more likely to be unemployed, while those aged 45 to 54 (1.3%) were less likely to experience unemployment. Further disaggregation by status shows that Caymanians and PR WRW had the top unemployment rates of 4.9 and 2.7 percent, respectively. Meanwhile, non-Caymanians had the lowest rate, 1.3 percent (see Table 17b).

### *Educational attainment*

Table 17b shows that among Caymanians, individuals whose highest level of education was high school were most likely to be unemployed (8.0%). Those whose highest level of education was primary and below had an unemployment rate of 5.9 percent followed by those whose highest level of education was post-secondary (4.2%) and college/ university (2.2%).

Among Permanent Residents WRW, The highest unemployment rate was amongst those with post-secondary education (3.4%) and college/ university education (2.8%). The lowest unemployment rate was amongst those whose highest level of education was high school (2.0%). Non-Caymanians had unemployment rates ranging from 2.1 percent amongst those with college/ university as their highest education level to 0.8 per cent for those with post-secondary education.

### *Reasons for not having work*

Most unemployed persons (48.7%) reported “no work available” as the main reason for not working. This reason was frequently cited by males (57.5%) and females (41.2%). This trend was consistent among unemployed Caymanians (49.1%), unemployed PR-WRW (50.0%) and unemployed Non-Caymanians (47.1%) (see Appendix Tables 5.8 and 5.9).

### *Job search*

When asked about the various methods employed to search for jobs (a multiple-response question), the most common responses among unemployed persons were “send out resumes” (20.3%) and “check websites” (18.8%). The unemployed also preferred to “ask friends” (18.7%) and “contact an employer” (15.9%) (see Appendix Tables 5.14 and 5.15).

### *Prior work and period without work*

Most (69.8%) of the unemployed stated that they had previous jobs; of these, 50.4 percent have been without work for more than one year (see Appendix Tables 5.16 and 5.18).

Among the unemployed Caymanians, 852 (74.5%) had previous jobs, while 291 (25.5%) never had a job; 53.7 percent of those with previous jobs were unemployed for more than a year (see Appendix Tables 5.17 and 5.19).

### *Training*

A total of 852 (49.0%) unemployed persons reported that they had been trained for a specific occupation. Further examination by status shows that occupational training was most common among Permanent Residents WRW (66.7%). Meanwhile, smaller portions of Caymanians (47.3%) and non-Caymanians (47.1%) were trained (see Appendix Table 5.36). In terms of educational training, females ( 17.0%) and Permanent Residents WRW (50.0%) had the highest percentage of persons who received training (see Appendix Table 5.35).



When asked if they had completed any personal development training, 75.6 percent of unemployed persons responded that they had not completed any. Examination by sex shows that a higher percentage of females (77.0%) had not completed any personal development training in comparison to males (73.4%) (see Appendix Table 5.43). By status, Certified First Aid training was the most common training completed among Caymanians (11.5%) and Permanent Residents WRW (50.0%).

**4.5 PERSONS NOT IN THE LABOUR FORCE**

Those who were of working age (15 years and older) and not working, not available to work, or did not seek work during the reference week, were classified as not being in the labour force. A total of 12,324 persons were not in the labour force, most of whom were Caymanians (73.6%). Females accounted for 57.2 percent of the persons not in the labour force. Most of the persons outside the labour force were 65 years and older (35.8%), closely followed by those aged 15 to 24 (33.4%). The proportion of persons not in the labour force varied by educational attainment, ranging from 0.7 percent among individuals with “no education” to 41.3 percent for “high school” (see Table 18).

#### *Reasons for not having work*

When asked the reasons for not working, the majority of persons not in the labour force stated that they were “retired/elderly” (38.7%) or “student/in training” (32.1%). These were also the leading reasons reported by sex; however, among Non-Caymanians, the top reasons were “student/in training” (49.4%) and “home/family duties” (22.4%).

#### 4.5.1 POTENTIAL LABOUR FORCE

Based on the ILO definition, the potential labour force consists of all working-age persons (15 years and older) who, during the reference week, were neither employed nor unemployed and were either classified as unavailable jobseekers or available potential job seekers. *Unavailable jobseekers* are persons who carried out activities to 'seek employment' and were not 'currently available' but would become available within a subsequent short period. *Available potential jobseekers* are persons who did not carry out activities to 'seek employment' but wanted employment and were 'currently available.'

Of the 12,324 persons not in the labour force, 436 persons constituted the potential labour force. The majority of these persons were Caymanian (52.4%), male (65.5%) and aged 35 to 44 (29.8%) (see Appendix Table 6.42).

## 5. OTHER FINDINGS

### 5.1 HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

Most of the households (52.7%) occupied rented dwelling units, while 44.3 percent owned their own homes (see Table 20). The majority of households stated that they had cell phones (97.9%), air condition (96.0%) and internet connectivity (95.7%). Meanwhile, a small percentage of households had domestic helpers (8.0%) or possessed landline telephones (17.0%). The total number of households was estimated at 37,621 based on post-survey results.<sup>1</sup>

#### *Ownership of Dwelling Units*

This round of the LFS captured data on Households by Ownership of the Dwelling by a Household Member (see Appendix Table 7.5). The majority of the dwellings, 92 percent, were owned by a household member. However, seven percent were not owned by a household member.

A look at the status of the ownership of households (see Appendix Table 7.6) indicated that 68.5 percent of the 37,621 dwelling units were owned by Caymanians. Non-Caymanians owned 13.5 percent of these dwelling units. Combined ownership of a dwelling unit, that is, by Caymanians and non-Caymanians, accounted for 1.7 percent. In comparison, dwelling units

rented from a rental agency or property manager were 4.6 percent, and 9.0 percent of the dwellings were rented from the owners.

#### *Estimated Rent and Mortgage*

The total estimated mean actual rent paid by a tenant was \$3,776, while the median was \$3,000 (see Appendix Table 7.7). The district of George Town recorded the highest figures, approximately \$4,009 and \$3,500, respectively. Sister Islands had the lowest estimates, with an average rent of \$2,164 and a median rent of \$2,000.

The total estimated mean mortgage payment was \$2,409, while the median was \$2,000 (see Appendix Table 7.8). The district of George Town recorded the highest figures, approximately \$2,637 and \$2,150, respectively. Sister Islands had the lowest estimates, with an average rent of \$1,321 and a median mortgage payment of \$1,138.

#### *Households with or without Insurance*

The Spring 2024 LFS examined households with or without housing structure and content insurance. Forty-nine percent of households had housing structure insurance, while 18.3 percent had content insurance. (see Appendix Table 7.11). Approximately 30.7 percent of those households with housing structure insurance had an evaluation done within the past year (see Appendix Table 7.12).
