

## 1. INTRODUCTION

This report presents the findings of the Fall 2024 Labour Force Survey (LFS). The LFS mainly provides information on the characteristics of persons in the labour force (employed and unemployed). It also presents demographic information on the general population, some characteristics of persons not in the labour force, and household characteristics.

The concepts used in the Survey are in accordance with the International Labour Organization (ILO) guidelines, and therefore, the indicators produced from the Survey are comparable to those used internationally.

The remaining sections of this Report present the methodology, the main findings with emphasis on the characteristics of the labour force and those that are out of the labour force, and other findings on housing characteristics. The Appendix presents the detailed tables.

## 2. METHODOLOGY

As in previous LFS, planning and execution of the Fall 2024 LFS was undertaken by the staff of the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO), a department in the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development of the Cayman Islands Government.

### Sampling design

The sampling frame for the LFS is the ESO's Household Register, which is a listing of all household dwelling units in the Cayman Islands. The last update of the Register was conducted in August 2024. Updates were also based on information from the 2021 Population and Housing Census. As of January 25, 2022, the Register listed 29,699 household dwelling units, which is the sampling frame used for this edition of the LFS.

Samples for the LFS were drawn from all districts of the Cayman Islands. Cayman Brac and Little Cayman were combined to form the stratum Sister Islands. Probability proportionate to household count by district, as determined from the ESO Household Register, was used when allocating the number of selected households across strata. Households were randomly selected from all six districts; within each district, the households were selected with equal probability. The probability of selection for the sampled households in each district can be expressed as follows:

$$P_h = m_h / M_h$$

Where:

$P_h$  = probability of selection for the sample households in the h-th stratum (district)

$M_h$  = total number of households in the sample frame for the h-th stratum

$m_h$  = the number of sample households selected in the h-th stratum

Based on the sampling design, 2,000 household addresses were randomly selected, representing 6.7 percent of the 29,699 households.

### **Fieldwork**

Since the October 2014 LFS, the ESO has been using tablets for electronic data collection in Grand Cayman. Included in the Appendix (see page 164) is a copy of the questionnaire that was uploaded to the tablet for this edition of the LFS.

The reference week for the Fall 2024 LFS was 22nd to 28th September 2024. The data collection took place over a six-week period from 29th September to 10th November 2024. The administrative data (births, deaths, and work permits) as of the end of December 2024, which were used in estimating the total population, were collected in early January 2024.

The ESO hosted its usual in-person training exercise to prepare for the fieldwork. A total of 54 persons, including ESO survey staff, were recruited in Grand Cayman, most of whom have prior household survey experience (census and/or LFS). In the Sister Islands (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman), two persons were recruited to administer the LFS using the questionnaires on tablets. Therefore, a total of 56 persons were eventually selected to conduct interviews in the Cayman Islands.

### **Weights**

The 2024 population estimate was derived by adding the natural increase (births minus deaths) data collected from the Health Services Authority and immigration (work permits, permanent residents and change of status) from the Cayman Islands Customs and Border Control (CBC) Department in the last six months of 2024 compared to the 2023 year-end population estimate.

The raising factors for Caymanian, PR/PR-WRW, and Non-Caymanian sub-populations were then calculated based on their respective population estimates,

$$\text{Raising factor}_{si} = \frac{\text{Population}_{si}}{\text{Survey Count}_{si}}$$

Where:

$\text{Population}_{si}$  = estimated population based on administrative data of status<sub>*i*</sub>  
(*i*=Caymanian, Permanent Residents, and Non-Caymanians)

$\text{Survey Count}_{si}$  = number of individuals from the LFS per status.

The household characteristics were raised using the district response rates adjusted for non-responses at the household level.

### Data processing

The survey returns were processed internally by ESO staff members. Data capture was built into the ESO Mobile LFS Project (LFSPrij) software on tablets. Coding of industries and occupations were also conducted internally using the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC) (Rev. 4) and the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO) 2008, respectively. Edit checks were conducted using CPro (Census and Survey Processing System) and SPSS (Statistical Package for the Social Sciences). Data were verified with cross-referencing information stored on the tablets or with a phone call to the respondent. A data file was then created with information from all households who completed the LFS interview (fully and partially). Finally, indicators were generated from this file using SPSS, and the final tables presented in this Report were prepared using Excel.

### Standard errors for main estimates

Given the nature of the sample design used in the LFS, the estimates were computed with a 2.5 percent margin of error. The estimates published in this Report's tables are rounded to the nearest whole number or person. The sum of the individual rounded numbers may not equal the total. In addition, the difference of one person for the same category in different tables is due to rounding.

Data representing the weighted responses of one individual in the Survey are suppressed and indicated by the symbol "...".

The estimates presented in this Report are all liable to sampling error. Their absolute sampling error increases with their magnitude, while the relative error decreases the greater the size of

the estimate. Generally, the smaller the *Relative Standard Error* (or *Coefficient of Variation*), the more reliable is the estimate. Because of this, comparisons of the larger estimates may be used with confidence, but small estimates must be treated with caution. The *standard errors*, *confidence intervals*, and *coefficients of variation* (C.V.) of the estimates for key variables for the Fall 2024 LFS are shown in Tables 2 and 3.

### 3. DEFINITION OF KEY CONCEPTS

#### ***Population***

In the LFS, population means the “resident” population; that is, persons staying or intending to stay in the Cayman Islands for at least six months. Visitors/tourists are not included in the resident population. Persons in institutions for more than six months are excluded. Family members of resident households who were abroad at the time of the survey but had intentions to return to the Islands were also considered residents.

The population is categorised into three sub-populations by immigration status: Caymanians, Permanent Residents (PR), and Non-Caymanians. Permanent Residents include non-Caymanians married to Caymanians, Permanent Residents with a government contract, Permanent Residents with rights to work (PR-WRW), and Permanent Residents without rights to work.

#### ***Labour Force***

The labour force comprises members of the non-institutionalised population (i.e., those not in residential institutions such as general penitentiary and retirement homes) 15 years of age and over, who were employed or unemployed during the reference week. All persons in the PR labour force in all tables and sections of this Report refer explicitly to PR-WRW only. Persons categorised as PR without rights to work are included as part of the Non-Caymanian Working Age Population.

#### ***Employed***

Employed persons are those who, during the reference week, did any work for pay or profit; that is, paid work in the context of an employer-employee relationship or self-employment. It also includes unpaid family workers who contributed directly to the operation of a farm, business, or professional practice owned or operated by a related member of the household. Based on the International Labour Organization (ILO) guidelines, work can be for as little as an hour during the reference week; it excludes unpaid domestic housework and volunteer work but includes those temporarily away from their jobs.

**Unemployed**

Unemployed persons are those who, during the reference week, are:

- (a) without work;
- (b) currently available for work and
- (c) actively looking for a job, or had definite arrangements to start a job within 4 weeks.

**Unemployment Rate**

The unemployment rate represents the number of unemployed persons expressed as a percentage of the labour force. The unemployment rate for a particular group (age, status, sex, etc.) is the number of unemployed people in that group, which is expressed as a percentage of the labour force for that group.

$$\text{Unemployment Rate} = \frac{\text{Number of Unemployed}}{\text{Labour Force}} \times 100$$

**Not in the Labour Force**

These are persons in the non-institutional population (i.e., those not in residential institutions such as general penitentiary or retirement homes)—15 years of age and over—who were neither employed nor unemployed during the reference week.

**Household**

A household comprises either one person living alone or a group of persons (not necessarily related) living at the same address, with common housekeeping, i.e., sharing at least one meal a day and sharing living arrangements. This concept is used for persons sharing an apartment or house or a one-room together. For further clarification, please see:

#### 4. MAIN FINDINGS

The population of the Cayman Islands was estimated at 88,833, consisting of 40,633 Caymanians, 8,184 Permanent Residents (including 5,464 WRW), and 40,016 non-Caymanians. Among them, 60,828 individuals comprised the labour force, 59,393 employed and 1,435 unemployed. These findings result in an overall labour force participation rate of 80.8 percent, which varied by sex and status. The unemployment rate stood at 2.4 percent, varying by status and sex (see Tables 4 and 5). Figure 1 illustrates the composition of the population and labour force.



### 4.1 POPULATION ESTIMATES

The mid-year population of the Cayman Islands was estimated at 88,833 for the period ending December 2024. The majority of the population resides in Grand Cayman. George Town had the highest concentration, accounting for 48.5 percent of the population. West Bay followed with 22.4 percent of the population, and Bodden Town with 19.9 percent. North Side and East End accounted for a smaller portion of the population, accounting for 2.7 percent each. The Sister Islands (Cayman Brac and Little Cayman) accounted for 3.8 percent (see Table 6).

The average household size was recorded at 2.31 persons. Bodden Town and West Bay exhibited the highest average household sizes, registering 2.71 and 2.45, respectively. In contrast, the Sister Islands demonstrated the smallest average household size, with a figure of 2.06 persons.

#### *Sex and Age*

In Fall 2024, the estimated population had a sex distribution of 49.6 percent males and 50.4 percent females (see Table 7).

Children under the age of 15 accounted for 15.2 percent of the population, and the elderly (aged 65 years and older) made up 8.5 percent. Collectively, these two age groups are termed the ‘dependent population’; these two age groups accounted for 23.7 percent of the overall population.

The working-age population, representing those persons 15 years and older, accounted for 84.7 percent of the population. This group typically engages in employment or job-seeking, marking their 'productive years'. Within the working-age population, persons aged 15 to 64 are recognised as the main providers of support for the dependant population (children and the elderly). The relationship between these dependent groups and the 15 to 64 year old cohort results in a dependency ratio of 28.0 percent.

### Status

Caymanians made up the majority of the population, accounting for 45.7 percent. Non-Caymanians comprised the second largest population share, with 45.0 percent. Permanent Residents had the smallest share, with 9.2 percent. Compared to Fall 2023, the Caymanian population increased by 4.0 percent, while permanent Residents and non-Caymanians increased by 6.4 and 5.4 percent, respectively (See Table 7).

Among Caymanians, 81.5 percent were of working-age age, while 91.8 percent of non-Caymanians were of working age. Among permanent residents, 66.7 percent were of working age (see Appendix Table 1.10). Higher percentages among the non-Caymanians are expected, given that the residency of most expatriates is contingent upon work permits.

**4.2 LABOUR FORCE**

The labour force is represented by persons of working age (15 years and older) who worked, as well as those who, at the time of the survey, did not have a job but were available and looking for work during the reference period. The Fall 2024 LFS counted 60,828 persons in the labour force (see Table 8).

### *Sex and age*

In Fall 2024, males constituted 51.4 percent of the labour force, while females accounted for the remaining 48.6 percent. In terms of age distribution, the labour force was mainly composed of individuals aged 35 to 44 (28.4%), followed by those aged 25 to 34 (26.0%) and individuals aged 45 to 54 (22.6%) (see Table 8).

### *Status*

The labour force distribution by nationality status showed that 37.0 percent were Caymanians, 54.9 percent were non-Caymanians, and 8.1 percent were PR-WRW (see Table 8).

### *Labour Force Participation Rate*

Table 9 shows the sex distribution of the labour force participation rate across various demographic attributes, specifically nationality status, age, and education. The total labour force participation rate (LFPR) was recorded at 80.8 percent (see Table 9). Non-Caymanians had the highest labour force participation rates at 90.9 percent. Permanent residents WRW closely followed with a participation rate of 89.8 percent. This outcome aligns with expectations, considering the work permit-oriented immigration system. Contrastingly, Caymanians had the lowest LFPR at 68.1 percent.

Analysis by educational attainment levels revealed that Primary and below had the lowest participation rate of 41.6 percent whilst post-secondary had the highest participation rate of 88.4 percent.

A review of age-specific LFPRs revealed that people aged 35 - 44 were the most likely to be employed or seeking work. The second highest age-specific LFPR was among people aged 25 to 34, whilst the age group 65+ had the lowest LFPR of 34.0 percent. The low participation rate among the elderly aligns with expectations given retirement age. Further analysis by sex revealed that males had an LFPR of 83.3 percent compared to females with an LFPR of 78.3 percent. Males had consistently higher LFPR across all age groups than females.

### 4.3 EMPLOYED

The term "employed" includes individuals in the labour force who worked for compensation, profit, or family benefit for a minimum of one hour during the reference week, 22nd September to 28th September 2024. Additionally, individuals who held a job but did not work during the reference week were also classified as employed, recognising their temporary absence. A total of 59,393 persons were employed in Fall 2024 (see Table 10).

*Sex and Age*

The employed labour force had a majority of males in comparison to females, with 30,685 (51.7%) males and 28,708 (48.3%) females (see Table 10). Analysis by age group showed that persons within the age group 35- 44 made up the majority of the employed labour force (28.7%), whilst persons aged 15 - 24 and 65 years and older had the smallest shares, making up for 9.4 percent of the employed labour force collectively (see table 10).

*Status*

Non-Caymanians comprised the majority of the employed force, with a count of 33,186, or 55.9 percent. Caymanians followed, with a count of 21,487, or 36.2 percent. PR WRW accounted for the smallest share of the employed labour force, with 4,720 persons or 7.9 percent (see Table 10).

*Employment Status*

Most of the employed labour force (91.2%) “worked for someone”. By sex, more females (93.7%) are employees than males (88.8%). A total of 4,929, or 8.3 percent of the employed labour force, are self-employed; this includes self-employed persons with no employees (see Table 11). By status, more Caymanians were business owners (18.3%) in comparison to PR WRW (8.3%) and non-Caymanians (1.9%) (see Table 12).


### *Occupation*


Figure 2: Employment by Occupation Percentage Distribution, Fall 2024

The top five occupations, accounting for 80.0 percent of the population, are professionals (19.4%), service and sales workers (19.3%), elementary occupations (14.3%), technicians and associate professionals (13.6%) and craft and related trades workers (13.4%) (see figure 2).

Further analysis by sex revealed that a higher percentage of males are occupied as managers (9.3%), skilled agricultural, forestry and fishery workers (1.3%), craft and trade-related workers (24.5%) and plant and machine operators, and assemblers (6.8%). Females are mostly occupied as professionals (21.9%), technicians and associate professionals (14.4%), clerical support workers (7.1%), service and sales workers (25.1%) and elementary occupations (18.4%) (see Appendix Table 3.36).

Amongst the employed labour force, a larger share of Caymanians were in the following occupations: managers (16.3%), technicians and associate professionals (20.4%) and clerical support workers (8.8%). In comparison, non-Caymanians are most prominent among service and sales workers (23.3%), elementary occupations (20.0%) and professionals (18.7%). Amongst PR WRW, the top three occupations are professionals (25.6%), service and sales workers (19.7%), and technical and associate professionals (13.8%) (see Appendix table 3.37).

*Industry*

The top six industries accounted for 56.1 percent of the employed labour force. These industries were construction (12.8%), wholesale and retail trade (10.9%), professional, scientific, and technical activities (10.0%), activities of households as employers (8.2%), public administration and defence, compulsory social security (7.1%), and administrative and support service activities (7.1%) (see Figure 3).

*Hours of Work*

The number of hours worked is defined as the number of hours worked by the respondent at his/her job (s) during the reference period from 22nd September to 28th September 2024. This includes all hours spent on work activities and overtime but excludes vacation, sick, public holidays, and other paid or unpaid leave.

On average, employed persons worked 42.8 hours per week. Further analysis indicated that males worked an average of 1.5 hours more than females. Further breakdown by status revealed that Caymanians worked 41.7 hours per week, while Permanent Residents WRW and non-Caymanians averaged 43.3 and 43.4 hours per week, respectively (see Appendix Tables 3.40 and 3.41).

*Earnings from Main Job*

Over half of the employed population (69.7%) earned at least CI\$2,400 monthly (see Report Tables 13 and 14). A higher share of employed males made CI\$2,400 or more (75.4%) compared to employed females (63.5%). By status, 85.1% of Caymanians made CI\$2,400 or more compared to Permanent Residents WRW (84.2%). Amongst non-Caymanians, the majority (57.6%) made CI\$2,400 or more.

#### *Employment by the size of business*

The vast majority of the employed labour force worked in large businesses with 50 or more employees (30.8%) and in micro-business with one to five employees (27.0%). Employment in large enterprises remained consistent among Caymanians (39.9%) and Permanent Residents WRW (36.5%) (see Table 15b). In contrast, most non-Caymanians (24.2%) worked in micro-businesses. By sex, most males worked in large businesses (31.8%), whilst most females worked in micro-businesses (32.2%) (see Table 15a).

*Training*

A total of 15,731 (26.5%) employed persons stated that they had received educational training. A larger share of employed females received training (28.5%) than employed males (24.6%). By status, Permanent Residents WRW (33.5%) had the highest percentage of persons who completed educational training, followed by Caymanians (31.9%) and non-Caymanians (22.0%). (See Appendix Table 3.8). Regarding occupation-related training, the majority of employed persons (72.1%) stated that they had received it (see Appendix Table 3.8).

Most employed persons (65.3%) had not received personal development training. Further breakdown by status showed that amongst those who had completed personal development training, the most prominent training program was the Certified First Aid training, with 19.0 percent of Caymanians, 19.2 percent of non-Caymanians, and 17.5 percent of Permanent Residents WRW completing this training program (see Appendix Table 3.17).

*Promotion at current job*

Most employed labour force had not received a promotion at their current job (75.5%) (see Appendix Table 3.18). The most common response for not receiving a promotion was “no opportunity for promotion” (59.3%). This trend persisted among Caymanians (56.1%), Permanent Residents WRW (61.9%), and non-Caymanians (60.5%). Similarly, by sex, “no opportunity for promotion” was the most common reason among males (57.9%) and females (60.7%) (see Appendix Table 3.23).

Among those who received a promotion at their current job (23.2%), the majority (77.8%) received their most recent promotion within the last four years. By status, 90.4 of non-Caymanians received their promotion within the previous four years, followed by Permanent residents WRW (87.0%) and Caymanians (67.7%) (see Appendix Table 3.20).

Most persons indicated receiving more responsibilities and higher pay with their promotion (80.4%). By sex, 79.9 percent of females and 80.8 percent of males received both more responsibilities and higher pay (see Appendix Table 3.21). Further analysis by status shows that 78.7 percent of Permanent Residents WRW, 81.2 percent of Caymanians and 79.7 percent of non-Caymanians also responded “more responsibilities and higher pay (see Appendix Tables 3.22).

#### **4.3.1 UNDEREMPLOYED**

Underemployment occurs when workers who could (and would like to) work for a full week can only find part-time work. It can also occur when workers take on employment that does not utilise all their skills and education. As a result, two different measures of underemployment have been utilised: the time measure and the skills and education measure.

The underemployed accounted for 13.3 percent of the employed in Fall 2024 (see Table 16). This combines a time-based measure of 7.4 percent (a count of persons working less than 30 hours and willing and able to work more) and a skills-based measure of 6.6 percent (overqualified for their current job and searching for a better job matching their education and experience). The time-based measure is higher than previous Labour force surveys due to a natural disaster during the reference week. This caused hours worked to decline and therefore classified more persons as underemployed.

By status, the underemployment rate was highest for non-Caymanians (16.8%), followed by Permanent Residents WRW (9.4%) and Caymanians (8.9%). By sex, females had a higher rate of underemployment (14.3%) than males (12.4%) (see Table 16).

Further breakdown by age group and level of education revealed that underemployment was most prevalent amongst persons aged 15 – 24 (15.6%) and persons with primary and below education (24.7%) (see Table 16).

Most employed persons (78.0%) felt their qualifications matched their current post (see Appendix Tables 4.24 and 4.25). This trend remained consistent by status and sex. More

males (52.6%) felt that their qualifications exactly matched their current post than females (47.4%) (see Appendix Table 4.24).

In terms of education, training and experience, the majority of persons felt that their education, training and experience is exactly related to their current job (61.0%). Further disaggregation by status also reveals that “exactly related” was the top response across all nationality statuses, most notably permanent residents WRW (70.4%) and Caymanians (60.4%) (see Appendix Table 4.29). By sex, 63.9 percent of males felt their education, training and experience was exactly related in comparison to females (57.9%) (see Appendix Table 4.28).

Persons who did not feel like their education, training, and experience were exactly related to their current job were asked to indicate whether or not they would prefer a job more related to their current education, training, and experience. A total of 9,004 persons answered affirmatively to this question. Despite this, only 29.6 percent of those persons were actively seeking a job. Among Caymanians, 28.5 percent were seeking a better matching job.

**4.4 UNEMPLOYED**

The unemployed labour force had a count of 1,435, which yielded an unemployment rate of 2.4 percent (see Table 17a). The unemployed labour force mainly consisted of persons aged 25 to 34 (413 persons), accounting for 28.8 percent of the total unemployed. Regarding sex, a higher percentage of females (59.7%) were unemployed than males (40.3%). Additionally, the count of unemployed Caymanians reached 1,048, with an unemployment rate of 4.6 percent.

#### *Sex, age, and status*

Unemployment by sex reveals that males had an unemployment rate of 1.8 percent, while females experienced a higher rate of 2.9 percent. An analysis of age-specific unemployment rates shows that persons aged 15 to 24 (12.2%) were more likely to be unemployed, while those aged 35 to 44 (1.3%) were least likely to experience unemployment. Further disaggregation by status shows that Caymanians and PR WRW had the top unemployment rates of 4.6 and 3.8 percent, respectively. Meanwhile, non-Caymanians had the lowest rate, 0.6 percent (see Table 17b).

### *Educational attainment*

Table 17b shows that Caymanians whose highest level of education was high school were most likely to be unemployed (8.5%). Caymanians with middle school (5.3%) and post-secondary education (2.9%) followed. Caymanians with college/ university education were least likely to be unemployed (1.5%)

Among Permanent Residents WRW, the highest unemployment rate was amongst those with primary and below education (16.7%) and middle school education (11.1%). Persons with college/university education were the least likely (1.1%) to be unemployed amongst Permanent Residents WRW.

Non-Caymanians had unemployment rates of 1.3 percent for persons with college/ university education and 0.3 percent for persons with high school education.

### *Reasons for not having work*

Most unemployed persons (56.3%) reported “no work available” as the main reason for not working. This reason was frequently cited by males (71.1%) and females (46.2%). This trend was consistent among unemployed Caymanians (56.9%), unemployed PR-WRW (50.0%) and unemployed non-Caymanians (59.0%) (see Appendix Tables 5.8 and 5.9).

### *Job search*

When asked about the various methods employed to search for jobs (a multiple-response question), the most common responses among unemployed persons were “send out resumes” (60.6%) and “check websites” (45.2%). Regarding job search, the top preferred methods used were sending a resume (59.9%), registering with workforce opportunities & residency (44.8%) and checking websites (44.1%). Among Caymanians, it was sending a resume (60.8%), registering with workforce opportunities & residency (56.9%) and contacting an employer (43.1%) (see Appendix Tables 5.14 and 5.15).

### *Prior work and period without work*

The majority (63.0%) of the unemployed stated that they had previous jobs; of these, 60.4 percent have been without work for more than one year (see Appendix Tables 5.16 and 5.18). This trend was seen among Caymanians (63.2%) and non-Caymanians (100%) (see Appendix Tables 5.16 and 5.17).

### *Training*

A total of 718 (50.0%) unemployed persons reported being trained for a specific occupation. Further examination by status shows that occupational training was most common among Permanent Residents WRW (87.5%). Meanwhile, smaller portions of Caymanians (45.1%) and non-Caymanians (41.0%) were trained (see Appendix Table 5.36). In terms of educational training, Caymanians (25.5%) and females (21.9%) had the highest percentage of persons who received training (see Appendix Table 5.35).

When asked if they had completed any personal development training, 67.8 percent of unemployed persons responded that they had not completed any. Examination by sex shows that a higher percentage of males (62.2%) had not completed any personal development training in comparison to females (75.3%) (see Appendix Table 5.43). Amongst unemployed persons who completed personal development training, Certified First aid training was the most common response (10.7%) (see Appendix Tables 5.43 and 5.44).

**4.5 PERSONS NOT IN THE LABOUR FORCE**

Those who were of working age (15 years and older) and not working, not available to work, or did not seek work during the reference week were classified as not being in the labour force. A total of 14,479 persons were not in the labour force, most of whom were Caymanians (73.1%). Females accounted for 56.6 percent of the persons not in the labour force. Most persons outside the labour force were 65 years and older (34.5%), closely followed by those aged 15 to 24 (31.0%). The proportion of persons not in the labour force varied by educational attainment, ranging from 0.3 percent among individuals with “no education” to 43.2 percent for “high school” (see Table 18).

#### *Reasons for not having work*

When asked the reasons for not working, the majority of persons not in the labour force stated that they were “retired/elderly” (37.3%) or “student/in training” (32.8%). These were also the leading reasons reported by sex; however, among non-Caymanians, the top reasons were “student/in training” (43.4%) and “home/family duties” (28.9%).

#### 4.5.1 POTENTIAL LABOUR FORCE

Based on the ILO definition, the potential labour force consists of all working-age persons (15 years and older) who, during the reference week, were neither employed nor unemployed and were either classified as unavailable jobseekers or available potential jobseekers. *Unavailable jobseekers* are persons who carried out activities to 'seek employment' and were not 'currently available' but would become available within a subsequent short period. *Available potential jobseekers* are persons who did not carry out activities to 'seek employment' but wanted employment and were 'currently available.'

Of the 13,616 persons not in the labour force, 858 constituted the potential labour force. The majority of these persons were Caymanian (67.0%), female (67.1%), aged 55 to 64 (32.9%), and had a high school education (37.7%) (see Appendix Table 6.30).

## 5. OTHER FINDINGS

### 5.1 HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

Most of the households (53.6%) occupied rented dwelling units, while 43.9 percent owned their own homes (see Table 20). The majority of households stated that they had cell phones (98.2%), air conditioning (95.1%) and internet connectivity (94.6%). A small percentage of households had domestic helpers (7.3%) or possessed landline telephones (14.5%). The total number of households was estimated at 38,377 based on post-survey results.<sup>1</sup>

#### *Ownership of Dwelling Units*

This round of the LFS captured data on Households by Ownership of the Dwelling by a Household Member (see Appendix Table 7.5). Most of the dwellings, 91.4 percent were owned by a household member. However, 7.0 percent were not owned by a household member.

A look at the status of the ownership of households (see Appendix Table 7.6) indicated that 73.5 percent of the 38,377 dwelling units were owned by Caymanians. Non-Caymanians owned 9.8 percent of these dwelling units. Combined ownership of a dwelling unit, that is, by Caymanians and non-Caymanians, accounted for 1.4 percent.

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<sup>1</sup> The total number of households was estimated based on the estimated population by district divided by the average household size by district. This method was adopted in view of the lack of a fully-updated Household Register.

*Estimated Rent and Mortgage*

The total estimated mean actual rent paid by a tenant was \$4,062, while the median was \$3,200 (see Appendix Table 7.7). The district of West Bay recorded the highest figures, with a mean actual rent of \$5,201. The Sister Islands had the lowest estimates, with an average rent of \$1,822 and a median rent of \$1,800.

The total estimated mean mortgage payment was \$2,277, while the median was \$2,000 (see Appendix Table 7.8). The district of West Bay recorded the highest figures, approximately \$2,4234 and \$1,800, respectively. Sister Islands had the lowest estimates, with an average rent of \$1,467 and a median mortgage payment of \$1,460.

*Households with or without Insurance*

The Fall 2024 LFS examined households with or without housing structure insurance and content insurance. The majority of households (45.1%) had housing structure insurance, while 16.6 percent had content insurance. (See Appendix Table 7.11). Approximately 31.3 percent of those households with housing structure insurance had an evaluation done within the past year (see Appendix Table 7.12).
